PENTECOST SUNDAY

“Let anyone who thirsts come to me and drink.”

- Jn 7:37b

Dear SPA Family,

There is a story in the Book of Genesis about the builders of the Tower of Babel. According to the etymology, the word “babel” means “confusion.” People forgot about the punishing waters of the Flood (story of Noah) and drifted further and further away from God. In their pride, they decided to build a great city with a tower reaching the sky (heaven). When it seemed that they were getting close to the goal the so-called confusion of languages happened. Everyone spoke a different language. Disagreements and feuds arose. As a result, not only did they fail to build the city and the tower reaching the sky, but they were also scattered all over the earth. The multi-faceted message of this story also includes the fact that building a human community without divine laws may end in failure, and that without God it is impossible to conquer heaven. When I was a child, I remember how the communist system in my homeland promised to build a heaven on earth without God.



To bring closer the problem of the so-called “confusion of languages” I will use an example from the life of the Polish community of a large city in the East Coast. Various Polish organizations operated here for generations. A group of post-war emigrants decided to establish the Jedność – Unity Association. The initiative group consisted of young, ambitious, and energetic people. They agreed on the purposes, goals, and structure. Unity began to bear fruit and profit. It was also possible to obtain certain social programs from the state budget for the Polish diaspora group. At the beginning, they all spoke one language, that is, the language of consent and understanding.

With time, however, they began to speak ‘different languages.’ The common goal was blurred by multi self-interests. Some believed that they deserved the president position because they were the authors of the success of Unity and had the best idea of how the organization worked. The president began to bend the terms of the Unity charter and fill positions with his own people, who did not always have the appropriate competences. There was such a confusion of languages that no one understood anyone. The meetings were led by those who shouted the loudest. The members of Unity lost their precious energy on slandering themselves in the press and lawsuits. As the confusion of languages deepened, the collapse of Unity came. Today there are buildings put up for auction, unfinished court cases and devastating animosity in the hearts.

On the day of Pentecost, fifty days after the Passover, the Jews celebrated thanksgiving for the harvested crops. At that time, pilgrims from all over the world were visiting Jerusalem, speaking different languages. And the Apostles, locked in the Upper Room, praying, waited for the Holy Spirit promised by Jesus. This invisible power of the descending Holy Spirit was accompanied by the sound of the wind and the flame of fire. The Holy Spirit descended on the apostles and gave them his gifts: love, wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, fear of God, the gift of tongues.

Filled with the Holy Spirit, the apostles went out and proclaimed the risen Christ with great power, courage, and God’s wisdom. They spoke one language, and everyone understood them. It was a language of divine wisdom and love - a language understandable to all of us.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

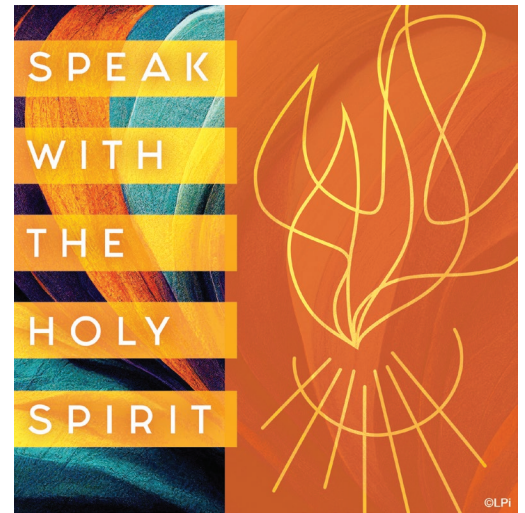
I hope you'll acknowledge with me a simple fact: it's not normal to have tongues of fire "part and come to rest" on people. It is actually pretty strange. Yet that is precisely what we celebrate in this feast of Pentecost. How can this mean something to us in our daily lives?

Jews had a tradition that heaven is a temple made of bricks of fire. So, through the apostles, the heavenly temple is coming to earth. But this fire looks like tongues, not bricks. That means that heavenly speech will be crucial to building a dwelling place for God on earth among men and women. So, it's no surprise when the apostles begin to speak in a miraculous way that is understood by all language groups. They are speaking of what God has done in and through Jesus: bringing heaven to earth and uniting all peoples to God and to each other.

How often our speech divides: gossip, slander, insults, and so on. How strange and rare it is when people speak in ways that truly unite instead of divide. Imagine how powerful it would be if you and I began to speak at home, at work, and in our community in a way that made people hear heavenly speech. Imagine if you spoke of the mighty deeds of God in a way that everyone could understand. That's precisely what the Holy Spirit descends upon us to do. Ask Him to come as a tongue of fire to you once again, and He will. Then speak!

is given for some benefit.

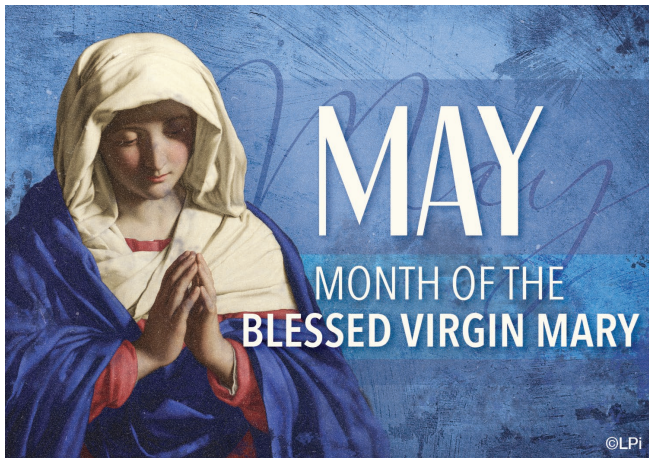
As a body is one though it has many parts,

How do we serve?

Here at Saint Paul the Apostle Parish, our Society of Saint Vincent de Paul (SVdP) Conference staffs a special hotline. Neighbors in need reach us by calling the hotline at 847-347-0832. SVdP is known by respective townships, the 211-resource hotline, and other charities in the areas we serve. Calls for assistance received by our parish office are also referred to our hotline.

The phone number is an answering machine manned by an intake volunteer, who returns each call. When calling back the neighbor, the volunteer expresses concern over the situation and explains a bit about SVdP, including, for example . . . “we are a volunteer group, all funds are donated and we are not supported by any government agencies.” If appropriate, an intake form is completed, which summarizes the neighbor’s situation and need.

The intake form is forwarded to the SPA SVdP board, who determines if a next step is warranted. If so, a visit with the neighbor in need is scheduled. Historically, SVdP completed a home visit, where a team of two Vincentians visited the neighbor in their home. Since the pandemic, the interview is handled by a phone visit and requires one Vincentian to gather relevant information and make a recommendation to the board. If we can help financially, a payment is made directly to any third party involved. If we are unable to help financially, we offer other resources to contact.

Here is an example of a recent case. Anita is a 59 year old single woman. She has been a waitress most of her life. She was injured at work 2 months prior to calling SVdP and had been receiving weekly disability. However, disability pay is less than she had been making and she could only pay a portion of her total rent, needing assistance to pay her rent in full to avoid eviction. Recovered from her injuries, she is now back at work full time. With assistance from your donations, Anita’s rent is up to date and her temporary situation is resolved.

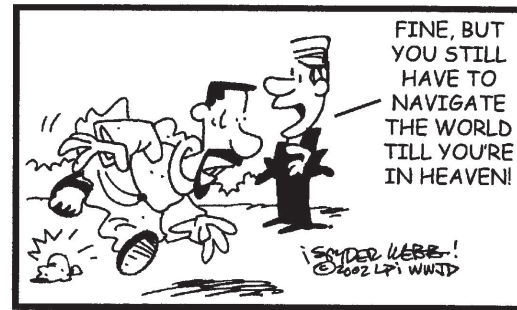

Question: Why Does the Church Have Different Liturgical Cycles? My friend has never heard of Christ and I want to share the Gospel with her but I'm afraid to. How do I share my faith?

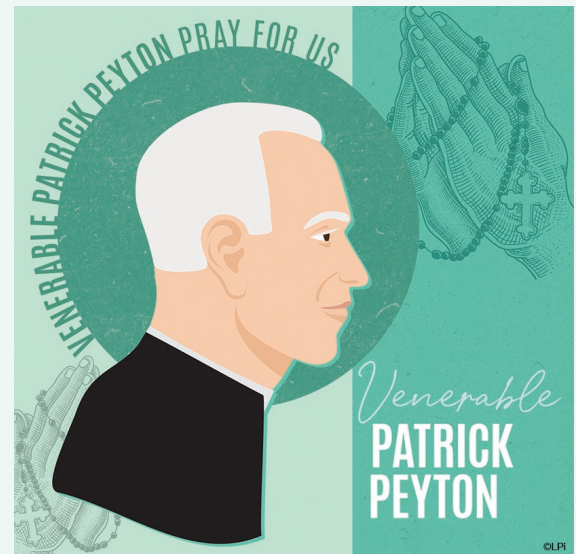
Answer:

There are a lot of ways to bring up the topic of religion, without being judgmental or pushy. Begin by asking what her thoughts are about religion, or what her experience was growing up. Finding common ground is often easier than you think, because the questions and problems we have about God, the presence of evil, our purpose in life, and our relationship with God are universal concerns. Why are you afraid? If you do not want to insult or offend someone, don't be pushy or judgmental. If you are uncertain about how to explain your own faith, do a little reading or practice with a friend. If you measure success only by this person converting, focus your attention more on beginning the conversation, not on bringing it to a perfect close! Faith is a journey of many acts of belief, many discussions about God, and many choices about how we practice what we preach. In some we will have great success; in others we will need forgiveness and perseverance. The most important thing to keep in mind is that the Holy Spirit is always at work and our most humble efforts can bear great fruit. Have faith in God because he has faith in you!
