This world is strange. We know the names of soap opera heroes, their fates, what happened to them, and can guess what will happen next. We cry and care about the characters on the screen. But in everyday life... we don't know the name of our neighbor. We don't know what the person behind the wall is going through. Not to mention the homeless person lying on the sidewalk in front of our house when we head to work or the store to buy bread and sausage for breakfast. You might think: he's a drunkard, a freeloader... I won't give him money. And so, our hearts become hardened...



And in the end, we will be judged on love...

I once had a conversation with a young Catholic woman about faith. She told me: "Father, I love the Lord Jesus. I love Him very much. Yes, I feel it in my heart." I replied: Well, that's beautiful. And I asked—what are you doing for Him? She couldn't answer that question. What are you doing for Jesus? How do you show your love for Him? You might say that you pray, go to church, or go to confession. That's good. But I keep asking—what's the conclusion?

What do you do for Jesus after prayer, after Mass, after confession?

You can perform all religious rituals beautifully and still fail to notice someone who needs your help. In the end, we will be judged on love... A perfect example of tangible love for the poor is Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta. A person deeply united with God. She spent many hours in prayer. But that's not everything. She went out into the streets, to the poor, the homeless, the sick—those literally wasting away in the gutter.

A journalist came to report on her work. A few days later, during a conversation, he said to Mother Teresa, "Mother, I wouldn't do it, not even for a million dollars." She replied, "Me neither." The secret of this beautiful ministry was discovering Jesus in the faces of the sick and poor. For her, every suffering person was a 'second Christ.' Everything she did, she did for Jesus. She didn't live a sentimental, emotional love for Jesus. Her life and her love were concrete! After death, she was judged for love. Today, the Church honors her as blessed.

In the end, we will be judged on love... Jesus is practical; love is practical. Let's be practical and concrete in love. Look around! Many people are in need of our help. There are many 'faces of Christ' among us that need love.

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**



Not long ago, I was called to a hospital to anoint a woman in her early 80s. She was dying, and visibly in pain. But what struck me most wasn't her suffering — it was the atmosphere in the room. She had eight children and 30 foster kids, and many of them were gathered around her. You'd expect sorrow, fear, maybe even despair. But the room was filled with something else entirely — a quiet strength, a kind of sweetness. It was as if she was suffering not just with them, but for them. And they, in love, were suffering for her. The pain was real. But so was the peace. I didn't want to run. I felt as if I was in a little paradise, beeping machines and all.

I think of that moment when I hear today's Gospel. Jesus, hanging on the cross, doesn't look like a king. But one of the crucified, dying men beside him sees through the suffering and says, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). That word — remember — literally means to make someone a member again. He's asking to be joined to Christ, to become part of his Body. And Jesus says, "Today you will be with me in paradise."

He doesn't say, "I'll take your suffering away." He says, "You will be with me."

That's the strange power of Christ the King. He doesn't rule by avoiding suffering. He reigns by entering into it, and transforming it with love.

What are you suffering right now in your life? Likely you want it to stop. But if we are willing to suffer with him – paradise begins even today.



#### TOM ROBB TO BE INSTITUTED INTO THE MINISTRY OF ACOLYTE

Please continue your prayers for deacon candidate Tom as the Most Rev. Timothy O'Malley will preside at his institution into the Ministry of Acolyte on November 16, 2025 at the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception, USML. Tom is one of 15 candidates to be instituted into this ministry.

#### Deacon Formation Program

As is noted in the words of the Rite, instituted acolytes "have a special role in the Church's ministry." The Rite notes the following responsibilities:

- Assist priests and deacons in carrying out their ministry at the Eucharist;
- As special ministers, they are to give Holy Communion to the faithful at the liturgy, and to the sick;
- Because they are specially called to this ministry, they should strive to live more fully by the Lord's sacrifice and
  to be molded more perfectly in its likeness;
- They should seek to understand the deep spiritual meaning of what they do so to offer themselves daily to God as spiritual sacrifices acceptable to Him through Jesus Christ.

Regarding the Ministry of Acolyte, Canon Law also notes that newly instituted acolytes must regularly exercise their ministry from this point forward if they are to be considered for the possibility of Holy Orders.

Presently, there are nearly 500 active deacons in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Please keep Tom, his wife Stacy, and family, and all those in formation and their families, in your prayers that they might continue to answer God's call in their lives. Family, friends, and parishioners are invited to attend the liturgy/institution.

Saint Cecilia's story, like many of the earliest saints', is largely apocryphal and legendary in nature. According to tradition, Cecilia was born to a wealthy and prominent Roman family. Though she had consecrated her virginity to the Lord, she was married to a man named Valerian. It is said that she was "singing in her heart to the Lord" at her wedding. She confessed her promise of virginity to her new husband revealing that an angel protected her. Valerian would honor her vow only if he too could see the angel. Cecilia told him he would see the angel if he was baptized, which he went to do immediately. When he returned to her, he saw the angel beside her. Cecilia also converted Valerian's brother, Tiburtius. Unfortunately, it was a turbulent time in Rome for Christians. Valerian and Tiburtius were martyred for burying the bodies of Christians, which was illegal. Cecilia was also targeted for her faith. First authorities attempted to suffocate by locking her in the bath in her home and overheating the room. Some accounts say that she didn't break a sweat and even began to sing. They then sent in an executioner to behead her, but he faltered and was unable to complete his task, only succeeding in mortally wounding her. She remained alive for three days before she died. The saint's body was exhumed twice, first by Pope Paschal I in 821, then by Cardinal Sfondrato in 1599. Both times her body was found incorrupt, the first saint to exhibit this extremity. St. Cecilia is the patron saint of music and musicians.
