Dear SPA Family,

Everyday life – tedious activities, illnesses, suffering, loneliness, problems at home and at work – this is our daily effort, a gray reality which often resembles climbing the "Stations of the Cross." This daily effort for us as disciples of Jesus can be a burden, a kind of ballast that crushes and destroys, but it can also be – and even should be – a means that leads to Christ, to God.

There are no easy choices in life. Every choice we make in life has its time, its place, and its price. So let's look at the words of Jesus and try to consider what are the conditions for following Christ.

"If anyone wants to follow me..." Jesus invites us to an effort that can cost us a lot, which can be paid with many tears, but only to give us happiness later – true happiness incomparable to anything we experience here on earth. Although the invitation is addressed to everyone, not everyone hears this call.

"Let him deny himself..." It is easy to marvel at Jesus who heals, works miracles, and raises the dead. It's easy to make promises like, "I'll follow you." However, it is challenging to follow the demanding Jesus, asking us to deny ourselves and give up our own plans, aspirations, and ambitions. We very often wish for a successful life, preferably in the spotlight. Meanwhile, Jesus encourages us to move into the shadows, to resign from being the center of the party, appreciated by others, liked, and admired for some of our qualities. Not only to fade into the shadows but...



"Let him take up his cross and follow Me..." It is difficult for us to take the cross of our everyday weaknesses, failures, painful experiences, dramas, or misfortunes that happen to us. Whoever really wants to take up his cross must accept everything that life brings us, every second of it, no matter what it is, and what it will bring with it. And although inner rebellion and fear will always be born, accept your cross with joy and willingness; despite the accompanying fear, and perhaps even discouragement, try to come to this cross with a smile and love. Hug the cross of Christ and feel its power and love flowing from it. And follow with Christ the "Stations of the Cross" of everyday struggles, challenges, and difficulties.

In creating us, God gave us freedom and the ability to choose freely, to make difficult decisions. And in this freedom, we can reject the conditions given by Jesus, because they seem too difficult to us, beyond our strength and capabilities. We can choose a different path, because we want to gain everything we care about so much: health, money, fame, admiration. But remember the words that Jesus said: *"What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?"* So what if we gain everything, but we won't meet God? We won't experience His love, we won't feel His forgiveness, we won't feel the purifying springs of His mercy.

Someone once said, *Your eternal life depends on the choices you make today in your daily life.* Think about it the next time you have to make another important or less important decision. Be brave and make a wise choice!


GOSPEL MEDITATION

Isn't it easy to relate to Peter? One moment Jesus announces Peter's deep communion with God the Father. The very next, when he rejects the logic of Jesus' suffering and death, Jesus calls Peter Satan. We Christians shouldn't be too shocked when we experience both spiritual highs and lows, when we perceive breathtaking contradictions in our hearts.

Like the great apostle, you and I are recipients of unfathomable graces. God dwells in us, calls his beloved children, and takes care of our every need. And we also continually fail to embrace our sufferings with trust in Jesus. We know the truth of the creed, but we easily scorn the weight of the cross.

The good news is that, like Peter, we are never abandoned by the Lord even at our worst moments. Peter will eventually learn the beauty of the cross when he is willingly crucified. But it took time for him to get there. And it takes time for us, too. This week let's not be too shocked at these divisions in our hearts but accept them and patiently seek to be more obedient to Jesus' crossshaped plan for us.







Q: What does the Church say about suicide?


A: Unfortunately, despite the Church's clear teachings in resources like the Catechism of the Catholic Church and the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults, there are still many people who are confused about what the Church teaches regarding the tragic reality of suicide.

While we hold that all life is sacred, we are also all-too aware that psychological, emotional and even physical illness — as well as extreme anxiety, fear, and abuse — can lead individuals to take their own lives. Speaking to this, the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults reflects, "Although suicide is always objectively sinful, one should not despair of the eternal salvation of persons who have taken their own lives. By ways known to him alone, God can provide the opportunity for salutary repentance. The Church prays for persons who have taken their own lives" (pg. 294). The text also states the reality of illness or other extreme influences can "diminish the responsibility of one committing suicide" (pg. 293).

Parishes and grief support groups should show special care and concern for those families that have lost a loved one to suicide. And, communities should always try to be mindful of those who might be at risk of suicide or self-harm.

If someone is contemplating suicide, please know that help is available, including the **National Suicide Prevention Lifeline (1-800-273-8255)**.

Venerable Mother Mary Theresa Dudzik became known as Chicago's Apostle of Mercy due to her work in the late 1800's and the early 1900's serving the poor and abandoned. She founded the Franciscan Sisters of Chicago – the first women's religious congregation in Chicago.
