


SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT - EMBRACE OUR SHEPHERD'S WORK

I'm in nostalgia-mode as I sit to write today. Last weekend, I gathered with family to see my niece, my great-niece and her fiancé who were in town for a visit. After catching up on the latest family news, we reminisced about loved ones passed. The approach of Mother's Day reminded us that we've lost too many moms. With that, we eased into an early celebration with smiles and laughter over each of these special women. Though none were perfect, each one made an indelible mark on those she was given to love. During the drive home and since, I've considered these moms and the dads who once walked at their sides. "What are you all doing up there?" I asked aloud.

At the moment, I realize that I didn't give those moms and dads the chance to respond to my question the other day. My thoughts had moved on to my own family's Mother's Day observances, the possibility of a new pope, this writing, and my dear husband's next homily. "The book!" Honestly, I'm looking forward to



listening one more time. I want to and need to be reminded that we truly are loved forever and always! With that, I delay this writing a bit longer to pray: "Thank you for that gathering. Thank you for my own parents. Thank you for inspiring that great little book. Please inspire the cardinals to choose a pope who

will acknowledge your love for us in everything he does!" I wonder if we'll know the name of our new pope by Mother's Day. I wonder if he will continue Francis' efforts to truly shepherd all God's people. I wonder...

As I continue, it occurs to me that it's a fitting coincidence that we read a gospel about The Good Shepherd on Mother's Day, on this Fourth Sunday of Easter, and in such close proximity to the election of our new pope. Of all the images of Jesus that the scriptures offer us, I find The Good Shepherd to be the most encouraging, the most comforting, and the most accurate! I also think it is fitting that Mike will read LOVE YOU FOREVER* again as part of his Mother's Day homily. We all need to be reminded that we are loved and cared for by the most dedicated shepherd and parent of all!

As I reread today's gospel (John 10:27-30), I see it is only sixty-two words in length. Though that might seem too little to work with, sixty of those words are attributed to Jesus. Those sixty words offer a powerful account of Jesus' love for us, and they portray Jesus in his preferred role -that of a shepherd. Jesus




respected the shepherds of his day, and he treasured them. Shepherds guarded their sheep day in and day out. Sheep knew their shepherds' voices and they followed them closely wherever they were being led. A shepherd's efforts allowed his sheep to spend every day and night in safety. A worthy shepherd never allowed his sheep to wander alone. Truly, a

shepherd's diligence was essential to each and every one of his sheep's survival. Jesus makes his thoughts on the matter quite clear in his description of his own devotion to his sheep: "...they shall never perish. No one can take them out of my hand."

Yes, today's gospel is very well-timed. It encourages us to acknowledge the relationship between Jesus' work of caring for us and our own work of caring for one another. On this Mother's Day, we celebrate the comfort we find in such generous love, both for ourselves and for the ones who love us. As we continue to mourn our Shepherd Francis and to celebrate his new life, we look toward our new leader. In him, Jesus' shepherding skills will live on once again.

Yes, we have much to celebrate today! We celebrate shepherd-dads who stand with shepherd moms to offer us their love. We celebrate shepherd-spouses, shepherd-children, shepherd-siblings, and shepherd-significant others. We celebrate our shepherd-neighbors, our shepherd-priests,

our shepherd-deacons and our shepherd-friends who bless us, each in his and her own way. We celebrate our shepherd-coworkers and our shepherd-grandparents, our shepherd-aunts and shepherduncles, and shepherd-volunteers. With all these shepherds at our sides, we stay on course as we

GOSPEL MEDITATION



A few years back, I felt as if I couldn't hear God's voice the way I used to. The words in the Bible seemed like cold ink on a page. Prayer felt like sitting anxiously in a lonely room. I was worried — how could I, a priest, preach or help others if I couldn't hear God's voice? It went on for months.

Then a friend encouraged me to go on a retreat and spend as much time as possible in silence. After a day or two of quiet prayer, I noticed gentle but clear thoughts of repentance in two specific areas of my life. I asked God for the grace to change, and I went to confession. Suddenly, the divine silence that haunted me was filled with a sense of God's closeness and goodness. I realized, gratefully, that God had been speaking to me in the quiet voice of my conscience.

This week we hear Jesus say, "My sheep hear my voice. I know them and they follow me" (John 10:27). Jesus links the hearing

of his voice to following him. He speaks to us in our conscience in an intimate, personal way, when we most need to hear him. When you feel deaf to God's voice, perhaps it is time to listen in silence for His voice in your conscience calling you to hear and follow the Good Shepherd of your soul.

Paul and Barnabas continued on from Perga and reached Antioch in Pisidia. On the sabbath they entered the synagogue and took their seats. Many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who spoke to them and urged them to remain faithful to the grace of God.

On the following sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord. When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said. Both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly and said, "It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, I have made you a light to the Gentiles, that you may be an instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth."

The Gentiles were delighted when they heard this and glorified the word of the Lord. All who were destined for eternal life came to believe, and the word of the Lord continued to spread through the whole region. The Jews, however, incited the women of prominence who were worshipers and the leading men of the city, stirred up a persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in protest against them, and went to Iconium. The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

Question: Why do Catholics genuflect?


Answer: Genuflection is an act of devotion that literally means "to bend the knee." For many Catholics, it san almost automatic gesture that we perform before entering our pew or row of seats at Mass. But, like many of the symbols and gestures of our faith tradition, genuflecting can also be an invitation for deeper reflection.

The practice of "bending the knee" is an ancient way of recognizing the presence of someone greater than we are. It has been said that the practice dates back to the time of Alexander the Great, but it became a common part of etiquette in the royal courts of the Middle Ages. From throne rooms and palaces, it was a small step to genuflecting becoming part of the devotional lives of Christians, who used this secular gesture as a way of recognizing the presence of the One who is King of Kings, especially in the Eucharist.

Today, Catholics are asked to genuflect in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (whether in the tabernacle or exposed on the altar during eucharistic adoration). So, while it has become second nature to genuflect before entering your seat in church, we should pay attention to where the Blessed Sacrament is kept in each church or chapel that we visit, and genuflect in the direction of the tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. In churches or chapels in which the tabernacle is in a separate space, we are invited to simply bow toward the altar.

In addition to genuflecting before the Blessed Sacrament, we are also instructed to genuflect before the cross used for veneration on Good Friday (during the solemn celebrations of the Lord's Passion) and any time a relic of the True Cross is displayed for veneration. This long-standing tradition is a way of honoring the cross as the great sign of our salvation and of showing devotion to the passion of lesus.

Reluctant Sheep
Sheep get an awfully bad rap, linguistically. Some are quick to label people as "sheep" if we think they haven't sufficiently questioned authority or if they're too willing to go along with someone else's plan. We say someone has "the wool over their eyes" if they aren't willing to see what we think is very obvious. "A wolf in sheep's clothing" is what we call someone looking to take advantage of those too gullible to identify a real threat.

Taking all this into account and considering how often we are referred to as sheep in Scripture, you've really got to wonder if God trying to tell us something about ourselves.

If you look at the phraseology associated with sheep, it's no wonder that nobody wants to be one. Sheep are innocent. Sheep can't protect themselves. They're vulnerable and easily misled.


We want to see ourselves as the opposite of all that. We like to think we're shrewd, with plenty of common sense. We want to believe that we don't have to rely on anybody for anything. We would sooner identify with the wolf than with the sheep — at least the wolf can take care of himself.

We do this because we often resist the need to rest in the greatness of God. Like a child walking to school alone for the first time (forgetting his mom is following watchfully in the car), we want to think we can handle it all by ourselves.


The truth is that God is trying to tell us something by comparing us to sheep: You don't have to do this on your own.
