


SOMETHING TO THINK BOUT - JUST FOLLOW JESUS' LEAD...

As I read today's gospel (Mark 1:21-28), I renewed my convictions regarding Jesus' teaching. I like the way he presented things. Unlike the scribes



who lectured in the synagogue week after week, Mark wrote that Jesus offered, "A new teaching with authority." The implication was that perhaps the scribes weren't as convincing in what they said as Jesus was. The scriptures suggest that the scribes' words and actions were a mismatch. Jesus spoke from the depths of his heart with neither

trepidation nor uncertainty in his voice. Perhaps it was this certainty that allowed Jesus to cast out the demon who tormented a man in the crowd that day. Mark wrote that the demon was certainly convinced of Jesus' authen

I understand why some of the people were taken aback by Jesus. Unlike the temple leadership, Jesus not only spoke his message. He lived it. He not only spoke of the Reign of God, but also made God's presence in human history a reality through his compassionate responses to all who needed him. In today's vernacular, Jesus talked the talk and he walked the walk!

A recent gathering with fellow retired teachers elicited lots of memories for me. I recalled a children's literature workshop some of us had attended. The presenter shared his experience using children's books to enhance a variety of lessons throughout the school day. I was taken by his message until he admitted to not having taught for several years. He said, "I couldn't take it any longer!" I wondered and almost asked aloud, "If sharing those books had really been so much fun, why did you stop?" Though his message made some sense, it was difficult to embrace. He was simply too far removed from us teachers who remained hard at work.

A year later, I attended another workshop. This gathering was called an *institute* because it wasn't meant to be a "one shot deal". We were expected to be active participants who worked hard in our classrooms with our students. The presenter's intent was to return us to our schools with new or enhanced skills with which to address both our students' and colleagues' needs. Though I questioned the wisdom of signing up for that two-day event, I quickly realized

why I was there. The presenter was a practitioner. She kept my attention the entire time because she spoke confidently from her own work and research. I left feeling more eager than ever to incorporate her ideas into my own work at school.

I spent most of my career working with children who were challenged by reading and writing. Very early on, I committed myself to doing everything

possible to see that every one of them had the opportunity to succeed at both. The wisdom of that second presenter stayed with me because she shared my passion. Though my work paled in light of all that she'd



accomplished, this master teacher inspired me to continue on. And so I did until my very last day of school not too many years ago. That educator had talked the talk and walked the walk, and she inspired me to do the same.

Through today's gospel, Jesus' words and work do the same. Everything Jesus said and did was meant to inspire us to walk the walk and to talk the

talk as well. It doesn't matter where we find ourselves, be it in a classroom, in our cubicle at work, at our kitchen table, or in line at the grocery store or the coffee shop.



What does matter is that we share Jesus' message simply by responding to those around us as Jesus did.


As for me, I'm willing to try. This isn't because Jesus *tells me* to do this, but because Jesus *shows me* how to proceed. Just as it was with my students and their reading skills, the more we practice, the easier it becomes. We acknowledge God's love for us and we love God in return by loving one another. Like Jesus, we need only to respond in the moment at hand as best we can.

GOSPEL MEDITATION



I love movies about exorcisms. Apparently, so do many others. The 2023 movie "Nefarious" features a possibly possessed inmate on death row. Critics were not impressed, but audiences scored it at 97% on the website Rotten Tomatoes. Most people have an appreciation for the demonic realm, even if cultural elites are generally embarrassed about it. As is standard in exorcism movies, the afflicted person (in this case, a man named Edward Brady) thinks and acts like *multiple* persons. He is someone besides himself. We know what that is like. We feel *fake* sometimes, not ourselves.

The same dynamic is on dramatic display this week in the Gospel. Jesus the Exorcist approaches a possessed man who utters, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth?" Notice the plural, us. The basic effect of the demonic is division. The man's identity is fractured, divided, and thus many. Jesus powerfully expels the spirit by saying, "Quiet! Come out of him!" Jesus' word has the power to restore the man's singularity — him — and indeed it does.

All this helps us to dismiss childish images of demons sporting red goat tails. Equally, it overcomes the cultured aloofness that dreams demons are mere metaphors for evil. We see instead that fallen angels are conscious and intelligent beings who orient their agency toward division. They bring about schism where there should be unity, e.g., in persons, families, communities, politics, and so on. Thankfully, Jesus commands demons to flee from all these places to restore wholeness and peace. What if we made room for his word where we need it?

The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him.


All were amazed and asked one another,





MINISTRY SUNDAY- JANUARY 27/28- WORSHIP COMMISSION

Altar Servers: Altar servers assist the priests and deacons during Mass and other special liturgies. This ministry is open to youth fourth grade and older. New altar servers complete a training session and are initially assigned with more experienced servers. Schedules allow servers to choose the Mass most convenient for them. Altar Servers are usually scheduled for Mass per month.

Art & Environment: Volunteers create the welcoming sacred space where we gather as a community to worship God by reflecting the themes and colors of the liturgical season. We need individuals who are willing to help with tasks such as sewing, carpentry, plant care, floral arrangements, etc., or occasionally to launder the linens used for communion each week. We meet most Saturday mornings.

Eucharistic Ministers: Communion ministers distribute communion at all Masses. A two-hour training session is required to provide spiritual background and describe our procedures. Communion ministers are usually scheduled once per month at the weekend Mass of your choice. Our large parish requires numerous Communion ministers, and we welcome newly interested individuals. All Confirmed parishioners are eligible to participate.

Music Ministry: The purpose of the music ministry is to give God glory and praise through music and to assist the assembly to participate in the liturgy through song. In order to help lead our congregation in song each week, we need the help of those individuals to whom God has given musical gifts. Those who have been given the gift to sing, to play guitar, to plays drums, or to play other musical instruments should contact Ruth Peck to find out how they may share their musical gifts for the Glory of God. **Lectors:** The ministry of Lector is responsible for proclaiming the word of God to the faith community gathered in worship. Lectoring is a charism for faith-building and requires some natural abilities such as

gathered in worship. Lectoring is a charism for faith-building and requires some natural abilities such as proclaiming skills and comfort with public speaking. Adults and teens who have made their Confirmation are invited to serve as lectors for our liturgies. Guidelines for the ministry and practical training are provided on a continuing basis.

Ushers: Ushers serve at weekend and holiday Masses by selecting the Cross and Gift Bearers, seating parishioners and guests, assisting physically disabled parishioners and guests, passing collection baskets, coordinating communion lines, and assisting guests who become sick or need assistance. Ushers serve at the Mass of their choice. Parishioners aged 10 and up are invited to participate.

Sound Design: The sound design team mixes sound for masses and other events. They also plan, configure, and maintain the audio equipment.

Projection Ministry: This team works in the sound booth at Mass which runs the projection for announcements, readings, and music. No prior experience necessary, we will train you!

Greeters: Greeters welcome those attending Mass with a warm smile and sincere greeting. We distribute the weekly bulletin, exchange pleasantries with parishioners and visitors, and reflect our parish's warm, welcoming spirit. Men, women, and entire families are welcome to join. This is a once per month commitment, and there are no meetings to attend.

Adoration: Every Tuesday and Thursday at 8:00am (following morning mass), join us to pray in front of the blessed sacrament.

Weekend Counting Team: A small team gathers to count the weekend collection.

Simbang Gabi: Simbang Gabi is a Filipino Christmas tradition. It is a series of nine dawn masses on the days leading up to Christmas. It begins on December 16 and ends at midnight on the 24th of December, when a midnight mass is held. Area parishes rotate celebrations throughout the series. Please watch the bulletin and website home page in November for the schedule.

Wedding Ministry: Our ministry assists with weddings. We meet with the couple approximately three months before the wedding to make sure that all their paperwork is in order and help them plan their wedding ceremony. When the couple approves of the details of their ceremony, I then compose a narrative play by play which is shared with the clergy and Music Director. We assist with the rehearsal prior to the ceremony. We coordinate on the day of the wedding with the clergy, florist, photographer, videographer, bridal party, family, and friends.

Fr. John Guthrie is a priest of the Diocese of Bismarck, North Dakota and is in his third year as teacher and formator at Mundelein Seminary.


A native of North Dakota, he did his college studies at St. John's University in Minnesota and his seminary training at the North American College in Rome.


