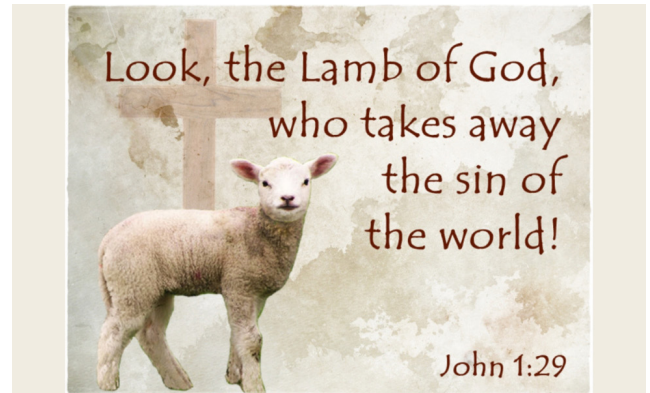


2ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away
the sin of the world.” - Jn 1:29

Dear SPA Family,

The last person announcing the coming of God's Son, the Messiah, was John the Baptist. His mission had two purposes. First, the Israelites' preparation for the coming of the Messiah, and then the revealing and presentation of the announced Son of God. Both tasks were fulfilled by John the Baptist. He preached the imminent arrival of the Messiah and called everybody to a change of heart and conversion. The outward sign of this was the reception of the baptism of purification in the Jordan. Jesus was among the many who came to the Jordan. When John the Baptist saw Him, he announced the arrival of the Messiah: "This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world."



And let's ask a question here. Is Jesus the Messiah accepted by people today? It is sad to say that Jesus does not arouse universal interest among people. Why is this happening? Jesus as the Messiah has become unnecessary to many people. This is because humans have lost the sense of sin, from which the Messiah - the Lamb of God can deliver. Very clearly and with great sadness, St. John Paul II, in the Apostolic Exhortation on the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. There is a tendency to make fun of sins, to minimize their harmfulness, or to deny them. People don't lie, but only hide the facts and stretch the truth. People don't steal, they only borrow. They don't commit adultery, they just enjoy life. They don't cheat; they just know how to combine. After all, people don't kill unborn babies; they just terminate pregnancies, abort the fetus.

People, not recognizing sin, trivializing it, not considering themselves sinners, do not need Jesus, because He can no longer offer anything. John the Baptist had this awareness of the sinfulness of our human nature, which needs constant purification in God's Mercy.

After His resurrection, Jesus gave the apostles and their successors the power to forgive sins, establishing the sacrament of reconciliation. If people did not commit sins and did not need God's forgiveness, Jesus would not have instituted this sacrament. Through this sacrament, Jesus not only forgives sins but also gives graces for a better Christian life.

People who do not have this sacrament or avoid it may be unhappy. They are tormented by guilt and remorse. A substitute for experiencing the sacrament of penance and reconciliation is sought in the offices of psychotherapists, psychologists, and psychiatrists. Does it bear fruit? There you can talk, confide in your problems, throw out what torments the heart, but you can never hear those words that we hear in the sacrament of penance and reconciliation: "Go in peace! God has forgiven you your sins!"

Let us thank Christ, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world, for His forgiving love. Let us ask for the grace of humility so that we can recognize and confess our sins in the sacrament of penance and reconciliation.

GOSPEL MEDITATION



It's common to hear belief in Jesus and the Church mocked as blind faith and credulity. But in reality, it is deeply human and rational. Think about it: we rely on the testimony of others constantly. I trust chemists who certify the safety of toothpaste and cleaning products. I trust engineers when I use a microwave or drive over a bridge. Why? Because they have studied and seen what I have not, and their testimony proves itself in daily life. That kind of trust is not irrational; it is how human knowledge works.

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist declares: "Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God" (John 1:34). That is the language of an eyewitness. It invites us into a very human act: trusting someone who has directly encountered something — or Someone — we have not yet fully seen ourselves.

The Church's faith is built on this kind of reliable sight-based testimony. The Apostles did not make abstract claims. They saw, followed, suffered for, and proclaimed Jesus Christ. Over centuries, their witness — carried in Scripture, in the lives of the saints, and in the sacramental life of the Church — has proven dependable. We come to know its truth by assenting to it, by living and studying it, praying with it, trusting it.

Faith in Christ is not a childish leap into the dark. It is a step into the light of testimony that proves itself over time.

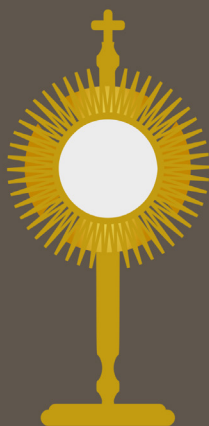

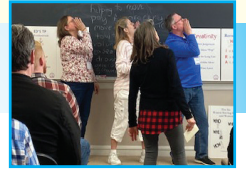

WHEN JESUS WADES IN

Usually, when God comes to us, we aren't ready.

We think we are. Like John the Baptist, we stand in our waters of baptism, certain of our mission. We know how it's going to go. We know what's going to be asked of us. We're sure of it.

Christ wades into the waters. And he screws up all our plans.

To be clear, I don't think John the Baptist lacks faith when he balks at the idea of baptizing Jesus. I think it is, in fact, a testament to his humility. But whatever motivated John's actions, he is — if even for a brief moment — hesitating to do the will of God. Just a few chapters after this in the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus will acknowledge that John is the greatest person "born of women" — with the caveat that even he is not perfect enough for the Kingdom of Heaven.

Not yet.

Jesus didn't give John an explanation as the two stood in the River Jordan. He merely said, "Allow it for now." John could have resisted further, demanding to understand why. He could have grown suspicious at the simplicity of Jesus' answer, at the strangeness of this request. He could have clung desperately to his version of How Things Are Supposed To Be, and in doing so, fostered doubt in his heart. He could have even stormed off, confused and angry.

He did none of these things, because John is, as Jesus says, the greatest born of women.

When the Holy Spirit descends and the voice of God declares, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased," he is referring, of course, to Jesus. But I think He would say the same of John the Baptist — and of all those who welcome Jesus into the waters, ready to do as he bids.

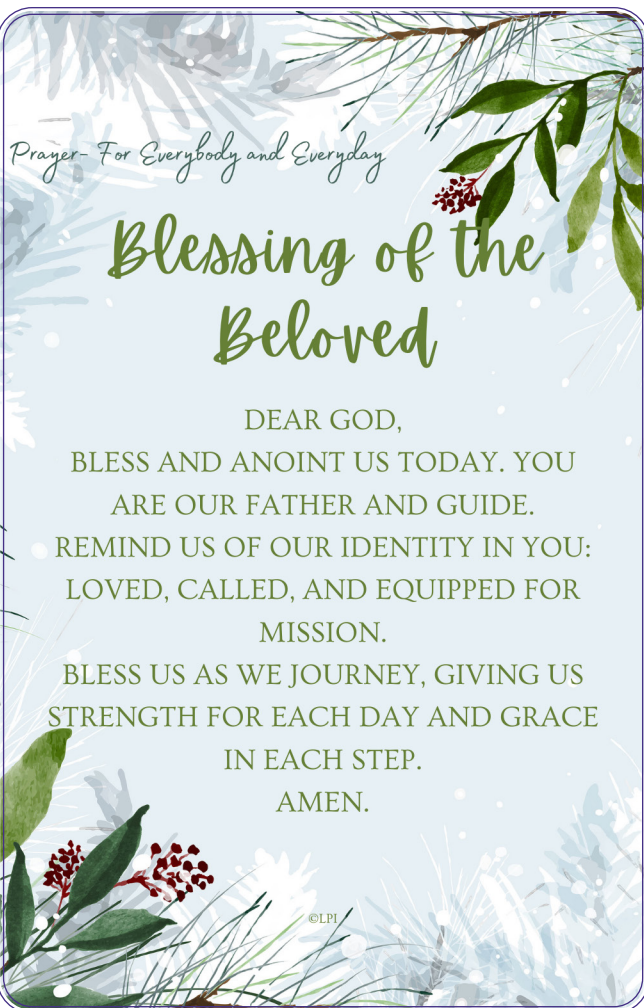
We will not be offering the Precious Blood from the 1st Sunday of Advent until Palm Sunday, for health reasons during cold and flu season, to avoid potential virus transmission. A Catholic does not have to receive both the Body and Blood of Christ, as receiving either one is a full reception of the sacrament. Receiving only one form is a valid and common practice, and provides the same graces as receiving both; we receive the entirety of Jesus in the Eucharist.

During the Communion Procession:

1. Approach the Priest, Deacon, or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion.
2. The Sacred Host will be lifted and shown to you, and the Priest, Deacon, or Communion Minister will say, "The Body of Christ".
3. Extend your hands or tongue and say "Amen".
4. Whether you receive on the tongue or the hands -- DO NOT MOVE -- until the Sacred Host is placed on your tongue or hands.
5. PLEASE DO NOT step to the side, but consume the Host immediately in front of the priest, deacon, or Communion Minister.
6. Then, you can return to your seat.

- If you do not receive communion and want a blessing, come, cross your hands over your chest to receive the blessing.

SAINT BIO

St. Marianne Cope | January 23

Barbara Koop, later Mother Marianne Cope, was born in Germany on January 23, 1838, and immigrated with her parents to New York when she was 2 years old. In August of 1862 she went to the sisters of the Third Order of Saint Francis in Syracuse, New York and took her vows the next year. Her early religious life saw her working as a teacher and administrator for local Catholic schools until she was called upon by the bishop to use her administrative skills as superior of St. Joseph's Hospital in Syracuse, New York. She devoted herself to the care of the sick and infirm and the hospital flourished under her leadership. As the Provincial Mother of her order in Syracuse, Cope, along with six other sisters, she answered a call made by the Hawaiian government to run the Kaka'ako Branch Hospital on Oahu that served as a receiving station for people suspected of having leprosy.

Of the more than 50 religious communities in the United States and Canada who were asked by the government to help the suffering communities and hospitals for those with leprosy (Hansen's disease) in Hawaii, Mother Marianne and her sisters were the only ones to answer the call. They immediately got to work transforming the hospital environment for those with leprosy and their families. Of this mission, she said —

"I am hungry for the work and I wish with all my heart to be one of the chosen ones, whose privilege it will be to sacrifice themselves for the salvation of the souls of the poor Islanders.... I am not afraid of any disease, hence, it would be my greatest delight even to minister to the abandoned 'lepers'."

In 1888, Mother Marianne and two sisters took on an even more challenging assignment and went to the Hawaiian island of Molokai, a leper colony, to open a new home devoted to the protection of girls and women with leprosy as well as to take charge of the home that her friend, Saint Damien de Veuster, had established for men and boys. She helped improve life on the island by introducing pride, cleanliness, and a little fun to the colony. She often provided bright scarves and dresses for the women she served and cheerfully carried out her mission until she died on August 9, 1918. While in service, she was awarded the Royal Order of Kapiolani by the Hawaiian government for her selfless love and care of those in need and never contracted leprosy. She was canonized in 2012.

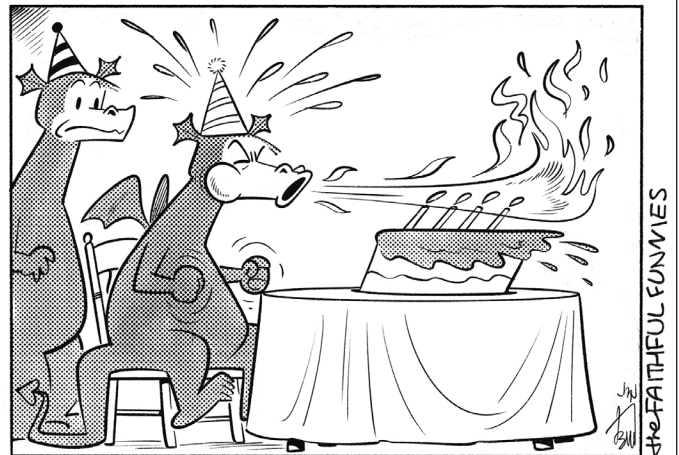
Attorneys work with the client to develop a next steps plan to address the problem and provide peace of mind. Training is provided to all attorneys at no charge.

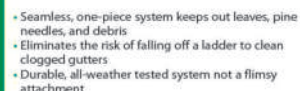

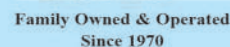
