

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT - IT'S JUST THAT SIMPLE!BY MARY PENICH

I'd never been much of a saver when it came to keepsakes and other material treasures. I grew up in a two-flat with no room to store nonessentials. Then, for my 12th birthday, my older sister gave me a scrapbook. I couldn't believe it! Finally, I had a place for my treasures! I saved birthday cards, report cards, and notes from family members who lived out of town. I saved the tassel from my eighth grade graduation cap and my diploma. What would I save from high school?

A few months into freshman year, I took a job in our high school bookstore. Though the wages were minimal, they allowed me luxuries like buying lunch in the school cafeteria rather than bringing something



from home every day. I also purchased some of my own school supplies. During sophomore year, my bookstore experience gave me the courage to apply for a job at our local grocery store. I saved this photo of me in my National Tea uniform in that scrapbook. (It was after work, and I was really hungry!) The hourly salary was excellent for that time. It allowed me to save money for college while I saved those mementos. I also worked for the best boss in the

world. I wish I'd had a picture of him for my scrapbook! You see, Mr. A. set the tone for my entire career in the working world. His amazing example taught me far more than any work manual ever could.

Though I'd had good people around me all my life, I'd never met anyone like Mr. A. At school, I behaved. However, if I hadn't, my teachers would have reported these incidents to my parents ASAP. Any omissions or misdeeds would also have been reflected in the grades on my report card. Working was different. I received wages for every hour I appeared. The only judgment I experienced came when Mr. A. scheduled those of us who did a good job for more hours than those who didn't. When I took that job, I put myself out in the world where I had to be myself and stand up for myself. Oddly enough, in the process, I saw God in a completely different and truly awesome light. Through Mr. A.'s example, I began to understand God's love and wisdom in sending each of us out simply to do the best we can!

Rather than guilting us into submission, our wise Creator sent Jesus to present "the rules" practically through his example. Jesus' guidelines were meant to ease us into loving one another and appreciating God's love for us. Jesus seemed to say, "God is nearby; you'll be fine." If people questioned God's love for them because

of their troubles, I imagine Jesus responding, "This is when God is closest to you! Don't forget that! God



will not lose a single one of you. God is always nearby!" As for me, it was while I eased myself into my almostadult life through that job that I fully

appreciated just how amazing this is. God really does stay with us in everything. Wow!

Still, this good news seems misplaced because the scripture passages we've heard in recent weeks are unsettling. Today, The Book of Wisdom (9:13-18) tells us that we can make sense of this life only with the Holy Spirit's understanding. But we wonder... What if someone isn't among the faithful? Jesus would respond, "God speaks to us all. We simply need to take the time to listen!" In his letter to Philemon (9-10;12-17), Paul tells his friend to deal with his runaway slave as he would deal with Paul. Paul befriended the slave and hoped he'd remain with him. When that wasn't possible, Paul sent the slave back to his owner and asked him to see his slave in a new light. But what if Philemon refused? Jesus would say, "You can't make choices for other people. You can only give them your best shot, offer them good counsel, and pray!"

In his gospel, Luke (4:25-33) challenges us further. Luke wrote that Jesus called the people to hate everything they held dear in order to free themselves to be disciples. But who can look at their families and their possessions and walk away from them? I think Jesus would respond, "I use difficult examples only to show you that it's tough to live as I do. All I'm really asking is that you do your best wherever you are with whatever you have. Then love one another. That will be enough!"

Okay. I know. I wasn't there. I can't be certain of Jesus' intent. Nonetheless, what I've shared has truly served me well. I know God today better than I thought I ever could. Though the scriptures are

sometimes challenging, their underlying message urges us on. You see, God loves us even when difficult words are needed to get our attention! In the end, I say, "As God's muchloved children, only what



is necessary is expected: to allow God into our lives, to do our best within our circumstances, and to help others along the way. It really is that simple!"

GOSPEL MEDITATION



One hot Arizona summer afternoon my car ran out of gas. I phoned the parish office and begged for help. My secretary came and helped me fill the gas tank. She chided me, "If you can't manage getting your car from A to B, how can we expect you to guide the parish where it needs to go?" Point taken, Julie. I vowed to always make sure I have plenty of gas in my car.

The Lord Jesus chides us in this week's Gospel, too. He uses the two images of a man building a tower and a king marching soldiers into war to make this single point: acquire what is needed to follow him or look ridiculous. We rightly mock the builder who lacks money for his tower and the king with a short-handed army. But our mocking boomerangs back on us. How do we expect to follow Jesus to the end with insufficient detachment from our possessions and divided hearts?

The good news is, there is still time. Jesus is building a great tower to heaven-his own body. So we renounce all and give ourselves to him as his

precious stones. Jesus is waging a battle against our enemy. So we forsake all and swear allegiance and march under his banner. In this way, we will finish what has begun in our discipleship. Or better put, our Lord will have the stones and soldiers required to see his great work through.


Or what king marching into battle would not first sit


SAINT BIO

St. Peter Claver | September 9


Born in Catalonia Spain in 1580, Saint Peter Claver studied at first at the University of Barcelona and then joined the Jesuits. He became friends with fellow brother Saint Alphonsus Rodriguez who encouraged him to be a missionary in the New World. Accordingly, Saint Peter went to Cartagena, a city in present-day Columbia where he was ordained in in 1615. Cartagena was a center for the slave trade, and the young missionary knew where he could best serve God. He proclaimed himself, "the slave of the Negroes forever." As ships would arrive with their human cargo, Saint Peter and a group of interpreters would rush into the hold with food and medicines.



When the slaves were moved to pens to await sale, the saint continued to work among them, communicating God's love with acts of generosity and teaching the Catholic faith. He also led missions in the interior, refusing the hospitality of plantation owners and preferring to stay in the slave quarters. He organized charitable societies and is said to have baptized and catechized more than 300,000 enslaved persons. Saint Peter Claver died on September 8, 1654. He was canonized with his friend Saint Alphonsus Rodriguez in 1888, by Pope Leo XIII. He is the worldwide patron saint of African Americans and of enslaved peoples.
