

# Dear SPA Family,

It is not wrong to have wealth, possessions acquired in this world, which we have earned honestly. Jesus, using such images in his parables, does not so much criticize wealth, the possibility of possessing the goods of the world, but rather shows what happens to a person who disposes them badly. The awareness of possessions, the awareness of our wealth and independence from other people, can make us creatures focused only on having, and having more and more.



But all this is not everything. It can also make us 'non-human' who will not see anyone except ourselves and what we have. The other person will not be of greater value to us... unless he is perceived as an 'opportunity' to gain even more from him, earn some extra money, or possibly to show off... let them admire.

As you read these words, you will probably think to yourself: look what kind of imagination Fr. Chris has! Yes, it's true, but look at the world in which you and me, the people of the 21st century, live. It seems that we live in times of abundance and incredible opportunities. A world so colorful, almost perfect, because that's how it is portrayed by marketing and sales specialists. Ask yourself: what value do you have today as a human being, as a person? Do not view yourself through the prism of the education you have, the amount you have, or the achievements you have made in your life. But look at yourself through the prism of something more basic - the value that is the human person ...

Jesus, assuming the human form, enters this world very imperceptibly, as a poor person. Why? On one side, He wanted to show closeness to people, but on the other hand, He desired to emphasize the value of a human being as a person. To emphasize that in His eyes everyone is important and each has its own value. And going to the poor, He turns the eyes of the rich to the true wealth to the true value that every human being has - not a thing, but a human person.

A scene from two thousand years ago, the scene of Lazarus and a rich man, is so relevant for us today. Let's get off our 'comfortable couch of life', go to the streets of our towns, and we will see and understand what Jesus is talking about today, both to me and to you.

Reading this parable, I wonder what am I doing with what I have received from God? How do I manage it? To what extent what I have opens me to other people, and to what extent it closes me, making me blind to their needs.

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**



I am embarrassed to admit that I frequently find myself dining and socializing with people who have millions and sometimes billions of dollars. I've eaten more caviar, lobster and wagyu steak than most people on the planet. I justify it by saying it's part of my job. But I have seven pairs of nice jeans and expensive shoes.

So it is rather uncomfortable to hear Our Lord say: "My child, remember that you received what was good in your lifetime, while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented" (Luke 16:25). Fellow rich people (and if you're American, you're rich), do we not vehemently though quietly object to this parable's karmaesque reward system? Why bless the rich man just to curse him later? And curse Lazarus just to bless him later? So Americans go to hell, while Burundians and Afghans go to heaven? What is going on?

One clue is that the condemned rich man doesn't complain of injustice. Rather, he simply begs to help his brothers to repent. Of what? We don't know exactly. Perhaps another clue is that the rich man now seems more like the downtrodden Lazarus. He knows what it is to be hungry and thirsty, to be wounded in the gutter; that he deserved that, not fancy meals and clothes. Maybe the rich man finally understands how to receive true blessings, but it is too late for him. But not for me. Not for us.


#### St. Francis of Assisi | Feast Day October 4

St. Francis of Assisi (1181 – 1226) left a life of luxury for a life devoted to Christianity after reportedly hearing the voice of God, who commanded him to rebuild the Christian church and live in poverty. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare, the Third Order of St. Francis and the Custody of the Holy Land. Born in 1181 in Italy, St. Francis of Assisi was renowned for drinking and partying as a youth. During a military expedition/battle between Assisi and Perugia, he was captured and imprisoned for ransom. He spent nearly a year in prison and began receiving visions from God. After his release from prison, St. Francis of Assisi claimed to have heard the voice of Christ, who told him to restore the Christian Church and live a life of poverty. As a result, St. Francis of Assisi abandoned his life of luxury and became a devotee of the Catholic faith.

Today, St. Francis of Assisi, known for his deep love of nature and animals, is the patron saint of the environment and animals. Each October, many animals are blessed on his feast day.


