

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT - A MUSTARD SEED REALLY IS ENOUGH!BY MARY PENICH

A few weeks ago, I had lunch with my sisters. One recently returned from an Alaskan vacation with her kids and grandkids. She happily shared the details of her adventure. I was thrilled to listen because Alaska is one of my absolute favorite destinations. Within the first two days of our visit there, I was hooked! Perhaps this is the reason I'm in Iceland as you read this today. Though I know the only ice and snow I'll see will be in the distance, Iceland's natural wonders drew me in. Perhaps I'll finally see the Northern Lights!

Honestly, I'm amazed by my enthusiasm because I really am a reluctant traveler. Though I've flown long distances before, I worry in anticipation of our departure. I worry about forgetting our



passports. I worry about packing appropriate clothing. I worry that weather forecasts might be inaccurate, and I worry about our excursions. Will we enjoy them? I worry about money exchanges, and I worry about a last minute illness that might curtail our plans. Yes I worry

curtail our plans. Yes, I worry a lot! In an effort to calm myself, I looked at images of Iceland online. It truly is a beautiful place. My sister's comments about her Alaskan adventure gave me an idea. Finally, I thought of a way to calm down...

I revisited our album from Alaska. While flipping through the pages, I lingered over a photo we'd purchased after zip-lining. I had to have a memento of that amazing experience! You see, though my husband enjoys flying anywhere, I don't. I'm also not a fan of heights. Still, I embarked on that completely out-of-character adventure that took us more than one thousand feet above ground for a mile-long ride! The zipline carried me high above Alaska's tallest treetops. What could possibly have inspired me to embrace that adventure?

As I stared at the photo, I recalled those anxious minutes just prior to sailing over those trees. Mike

and I went to our assigned seats and strapped ourselves into something that resembled an adult-sized baby swing. The man who would release us into the air checked every seatbelt. When he was certain all was well, he announced, "Here you go!" Suddenly, the gates in front of us dropped and we sailed -No, we



sped!- down that mountainside and over a forest. As I type, I continue to be amazed over just how high we were. I looked over the trees and onto the nearby inlet where a cruise ship rested. I clearly recall letting go of that swing and extending my arms as far as they'd reach. That memory inspired me to repeat what I'd shouted

more than a decade ago: "Thank you, God! Thank you so much! This is awesome!"

As I sailed over those trees, I knew I was nestled in the strongest and gentlest of hands. I'd also discovered one of God's best kept secrets: God keeps such diligent watch over Creation because there is nothing more beautiful! That day, I felt closer to our generous Creator than ever. I'm still convinced that I had to go zip lining so God could share this reality with me. When I turned to today's scripture passages, I found some evidence to support my thinking.

The readings from Habakkuk (I:2-3; 2:2-4), 2 Timothy (I:6-8, I3-I4) and Luke (I7:5-I0) speak of the things that fuel our faith in God. Habakkuk complains that his life and the world around him are complete disasters. God responds by asking Habakkuk to revisit his dreams because his dreams would indeed be fulfilled. "You'll find me there," God seems to say. In the letter to Timothy, this young man

is encouraged to hold tightly to his faith because he would indeed find God in the end. Was I able to let go of my swing because I knew I'd already found God? Jesus seems to summarize everything in today's gospel. He tells his friends that faith even as tiny as a mustard seed is capable of ordering a tree to uproot itself from the ground and to replant itself in the sea. Jesus explained further that having faith doesn't mean that



this life will unfold perfectly. However, Jesus does say that having faith somehow makes things happen as they should. Jesus asks us to do what we do because we *truly* can make a difference. Just as Jesus asks us to have faith in God, Jesus acknowledges that God has faith in us!

Fortunately, while we were packing for Iceland, I realized I would have missed a life-changing experience if I hadn't climbed onto that zip rider and opened myself to what God had in store. Of course, I had to go! I think that leap of faith exemplifies what God asks of us today. When I return home, not much will have changed. This world's suffering will continue. However, I'll happily and hopefully acknowledge that God understands our suffering far better than we do. Still, God urges us on. Why? Because, when we embrace the moment, the hour, the day, and the lifetime at hand, God is with us. You see, this is what faith is all about. This is the reason that even faith as small as a mustard seed is enough!

GOSPEL MEDITATION



A priest friend of mine received a call from a family whose elderly mother was dying. Within thirty minutes, he was at her bedside, offering the consolation of the sacraments, anointing her with the oil of the sick, and commending her soul to God. She passed not long after, and for months, her family spoke of their deep gratitude for his presence. When I phoned him to commend his faithful ministry, he simply said, "I was just doing my job.

His words brought to mind Jesus' teaching this week in Luke 17:10: "So you also, when you have done everything you were told to do, should say, "We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty." In a world that often seeks recognition and applause, the Lord invites us into a different mindset — one of humble service. The priest did not see his response as extraordinary; he saw it as a grace to fulfill his vocation.

How tempting it is to seek affirmation for doing what I ought to do! Yet Jesus reminds us that true discipleship is not about grandstanding but about quiet faithfulness. It is enough to have served. It is enough to have loved. It is enough to be grateful that we were given the chance to do our duty in the first place. Whether in priesthood, parenthood, or any vocation, what peace-soaked freedom there is in simply doing what is asked of us. No more, no less. Jesus, that is how you quietly love us.





SAINT BIO

Saint Bruno of Cologne | October 6

Bruno, born in 1030, is also known as Saint Bruno the Carthusian for the monastic order he founded. He studied in Reims and was ordained in Cologne in 1055. In 1057 he went back to Reims to lead the school, a post he kept for almost 20 years. He was made chancellor of the church of Reims in 1075 but left soon after in protest of the behavior of new bishop Manasses de Gournai who was finally deposed in 1080. Bruno refused the nomination to replace de Gournai as it was his intention to retire to live in solitude and prayer. He had a vision in a dream to go with Bishop (later Saint) Hugh of Grenoble. Bruno, Hugh, and five other religious settled at Chartreuse and founded the Carthusian order in 1084.


This first period of monastic life was not to last long. Bruno was called to help Urban II, a former student of his, against the antipope Guibert of Ravenna and the hostile Holy Roman Emperor Henry IV. While working with Urban II, he rejected another offer to become bishop, this time of Calabria. Eventually Bruno was allowed to return to monastic life. Count Roger of Sicily and Calabria befriend Bruno and the monks of his order, granting them the land where they founded St. Mary's at La Torre. The order was known for its strict asceticism, poverty, and prayer and its unique organization combining the life of the hermit with that of the collective life of traditional monks.

Saint Bruno wrote several commentaries on the psalms and on St. Paul's epistles. He died on October 6, 1101, and was never formally canonized because his order renounces all public honors. However, Pope Leo X gave permission for Carthusians to celebrate his feast in 1514 and his name was added to the Roman calendar in 1623.
