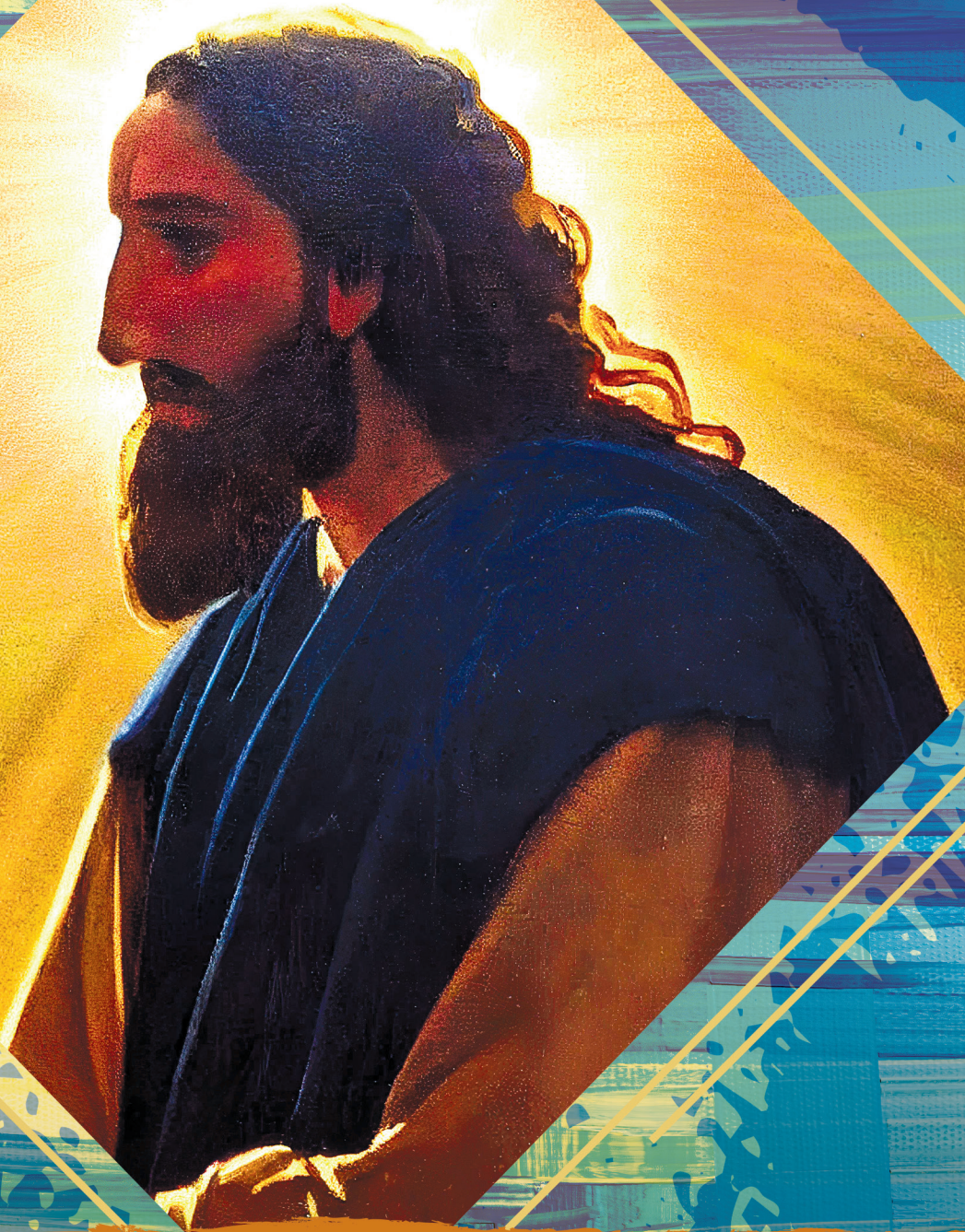

Dear Saint Paul the Apostle Family,



It is with a mixture of profound gratitude and a heavy heart that I write this, my final letter to you as your pastor. **Serving this congregation has been one of the greatest privileges of my life.**

I have watched your families grow, your resilience shine through adversity, and your commitment to this community deepen. Thank you for welcoming me into your lives, allowing me to walk alongside you, and teaching me so much about how to be your pastor.

While endings can be difficult, I am comforted knowing that my departure is an opportunity for new beginnings. As you transition to a new chapter, I humbly ask that you welcome Fr. Andrew Wawrzyn with open hearts and the same warmth you have always shown me. Please continue to support him with your prayers, just as I will be praying for this church in the seasons to come.

I will miss the privilege of walking, praying, and worshipping with you through the many new beginnings in your lives; **I will miss the joy of being part of St. Paul the Apostle Church in the years ahead.** And yet, I am excited about the opportunity to be attuned to the many other ways God is calling me to be present in the lives of my new parish, St. Anne in Barrington, and in the wider Church of Jesus Christ.

It has been my deepest honor to have served as priest of four different congregations over more than nineteen years of ministry. In these years, our world and the Church have changed. Through it all, Christ's power and grace have sustained us, for we serve a God who will not let us go.

In the past seven years of ministry with SPA, **I have been so very blessed to work alongside wonderful priests, deacons, committed staff, parish leaders, and parishioners** who desire above all else to serve God with energy, enthusiasm, and grace. I will treasure each one of you in my heart forever, and I will always cherish the memories of our times together.

I am so very thankful for these years spent in ministry together with you, and I know that God will continue to bless you abundantly in the years ahead.

These are my final days with you, but I look forward as much as I can to worshipping with you, enjoying fellowship, and celebrating the wonderful future God has in store for SPA.

"I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you, praying always with joy in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus. It is right that I should think this way about all of you, because I hold you in my heart, you who are all partners with me in grace, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception, to discern what is of value, so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God". — St. Paul wrote to the Philippians; 1:3-10

GOSPEL MEDITATION



Jean Améry, a Holocaust survivor tortured by the Nazis, later wrote about the abyss of human evil. He described his reaction as an “indignant despair.” Haven’t we all, to some degree, felt that abyss opened beneath us? A sudden loss, a violent headline, a moment of loneliness or panic, when the world feels fragile and meaning seems to collapse?

It is to this fear that Jesus speaks in today’s Gospel: “Do not be afraid of those who can kill the body.” (Matthew 10:28) He does not deny evil or pretend we will never suffer. Instead, He reframes the abyss: do not fear those who can kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Your life is seen, known, and counted by the Father. Even the hairs of your head, even the sparrow’s fall.

This is no superficial comfort. Jesus himself has entered the abyss: suffering, death, even our sense of forsakenness, and he has come through it. That is why his words, “Do not be afraid,” hold such weight. They do not erase the abyss but build a bridge across it.

Faith is not pretending everything is fine. It is staring into the abyss and still choosing trust. And in that trust, we discover we are never alone. Christ stands with us, and the Father’s care surrounds us. That is the only comfort deep enough for our (often fearful) hearts.
