SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT- Have A God Day!

I prefer faceto-face encounters to phone
calls. Still, a phone call is far
more enjoyable than an email
or text. Nonetheless, I admit
to communicating via email
and text messages regularly.
The good news is that I use
both to reach out to family,
friends, and others on every

day. The bad news is that I haven't yet perfected my ability to send concise emails or texts. My lengthy texts are proof that I can't edit my messages simply because of the medium I'm using. Perhaps it's the writer in me who insists upon embellishing those messages. The best I've been able to do is to close with a simple wish: *Have a good day!*

Another bit of bad news is that I think far more quickly than I type. I'm most grateful that automatic spell-check catches *most* of my errors. I wrote *most* because spell-check never catches my most frequent error. More often than not, when I intend to close my messages with "Have a *good* day!", I type "Have a *god* day!" This persistent error has puzzled me for some time. Had I hit the "O" key so quickly that the second "o" didn't register?

It took months for me to realize that g-o-d is far more than the misspelling of *good*. Truly, g-o-d is the single most important word that I know. Perhaps my frequent error was a subconscious or an inspired effort to offer the recipients of my messages much more than a *good day*. Perhaps my error wasn't a spelling error, but rather an error in capitalization. Perhaps I should have been typing, "Have a *God* day!" all along. I'm sharing this keyboarding adventure with you because "God days" seem to be at the core of Jesus' message to us this Ascension Day.

Jesus ended his earthly time with his friends with specific language regarding his absolute faith in and love for each one of them. Jesus reminded them that, if they took his words to heart, every day they lived would be a *God day* for them. Though we hear different Ascension gospels each year, the core of Jesus' message remains the same. Luke (24:46-53) tells us Jesus said, "And behold I am sending

the promise of my Father upon you." Luke assured us of Jesus' promise that God will be with us in everything. In Mark's account (Mark 16:15-20), Jesus asked his disciples to "Go into the world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." By sharing these promises, Jesus' friends assured



all who listened of God's love for them. Today, Matthew (28:16-20) shares Jesus' promise: "I will be with you always, until the end of the world." Yes, Jesus would remain at their sides and our own through everything.

Only John's gospel ends without a reference to the Ascension. Perhaps John felt that Jesus had said all that he needed to say long before that day. When John's gospel is read on Ascension Day, we cite this reference to the Last Supper: "Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed, saying: 'Holy Father, I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word..." Jesus' prayer included not only the disciples who walked with him, but also all of us who would eventually be touched by their efforts. Yes! *God days* are intended for us all!

On this Ascension
Day, as I consider Jesus' last
conversations with his friends,
I can't help reassuring us all
that Jesus' words are intended
for every one of us. You and I
are invited to join the disciples
in making every day a *God*day. Jesus' interactions with



those around him included his repeated declarations that they were loved. When Jesus left his disciples that day, he hoped that they and all of us would assure one another and all people everywhere of the same. Whenever we share this precious message with those around us, we make their days and our own *God days*. This Ascension Day, I'm certain that my spelling was not in error after all. It was simply my bumbling effort to encourage as many people as possible to have a *God day*. It seems to me that this is precisely what God intends for us all today and forever!

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Traditionally, the four writers of the Gospels are symbolized by four creatures that make their way into Church art and architecture: Matthew, an angel; Mark, a lion; Luke, an ox; and John, an eagle. These images can be found in churches across the world, a nod to those who recorded the stories of Jesus for us, thousands of years ago.

Today's Gospel was written by John. There are a few reasons why John is symbolized by an eagle, but my favorite explanation is that his writings soar like an eagle into the sky with their beautiful, poetic language. The prayer we hear today is no different — Jesus invokes God in a long discourse that might seem mystifying at times, the same way that a poem can be perplexing to understand when we are unfamiliar with the pacing or format.

Consider holding onto the shortest sentence in this prayer: "I pray for them."

Jesus prays for us. For me. For you.

Let that sink deep into your being.

Jesus is on your side. He is aware of what you are holding at this moment. He is aware of your pain, your faith, your mission. And He's rooting for you. This prayer was recorded thousands of years ago, far before you were born. Since before you were held in prayer. With that certainty, we live.

CATHOLIC Q&A

Question: Why Does the Church Have Different Liturgical Cycles?


While most Catholics know that the Church Year is divided into various seasons (e.g. Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, etc.), many are unaware that the one Church Year is not like the one that follows. While the main seasons and feasts are the same from year to year, the 3-year cycle for Sundays and the 2-year cycle for weekdays means that, as a general rule, the readings in the Lectionary that we hear at Mass will change from year to year, helping us to have a richer encounter with Sacred Scripture. Each new cycle begins with the beginning of the liturgical year, the First Sunday of Advent First Sunday of Advent.

The reasoning behind this innovation is outlined in Sacrosanctum Concilium, the "Dogmatic Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy" of the Second Vatican Council: "The treasures of the bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God's word. In this way a more representative portion of the holy scriptures will be read to the people in the course of a prescribed number of years" (no. 51). This was fully achieved in 1969 when the new cycles of readings were approved by Pope Saint Paul VI.
