SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT - SPRED THE WORD! BY MARY PENICH

Today's gospel (Matthew 16:13-20) tells the story of how Simon became known as Peter. Jesus called his friend by this new name because Simon bravely spoke from his heart regarding his faith in Jesus. Though Simon didn't know what he was getting himself into, he found the courage to step up. Today, I'm sharing my experience of stepping up. Like Peter, my relationship with Jesus changed forever when I said, "Yes!"

I was a sophomore in high school, and I couldn't



resist this unexpected opportunity. Staff from the Archdiocese of Chicago had developed SPRED, a special religious education program. They planned to establish a site at a nearby parish. The team needed volunteers to set up for sessions, to serve as gofers during those sessions, and to clean-up afterward. Though the program's name was new to me, its goals were not. I was drawn

in by the students whom the program served. I asked myself, "How can I not do this?"

A few weeks later, a classmate and I arrived enthusiastically early for the first meeting. That week, no children were present. Only staff and volunteers gathered to get to know the new environment and one another. Their ability to gather, work, play and pray together was essential to their relationships with the children. How surprised and grateful I was when the team included my classmate and me in all of that working, playing, and praying! I'd never felt as relied upon or needed as I did that day. Two weeks later, we set up and opened the doors and our hearts to the children we'd serve.

Those children resembled some special people with whom I'd grown up! I saw Maureen, Danny, and Marty in their faces. Though they didn't look at all like my old friends, they smiled and laughed and basked in kindness just as my friends had. I watched happily as the adults welcomed their special friends to the session. They began with joyful greetings and farewells to family members who'd dropped off the children. Then, each adult friend and special friend engaged in a calming activity. Sometimes, they poured rice from a pitcher to a bowl. Sometimes, they kneaded clay in their hands. Sometimes, they made something and sometimes they simply concentrated on that soft squishy mass. Whichever of the activities they chose, it allowed both adult and child to calm themselves and to bond in the peaceful environment we'd created. I

can't help smiling as I write! I remember wishing that my high school religion classes were as calming as those SPRED sessions!

After activity time, the adults and children gathered to hear the day's message. The Lead Catechist presented a passage from scripture in language just right for the children. I imagined Jesus speaking to the children that way! Afterward, the Lead Catechist offered a few words regarding what was read. Then, all of those present were invited to share. Usually, the children responded. You see, they'd gotten the message and they simply had to let the rest of us know! Often, the adults responded as well. Even my classmate and I were invited to share our thoughts. Honestly, I was in religion class heaven!

I'm sharing all of this with you because my experience with SPRED remains with me. I continued to set up that environment until I graduated high school. It was then that Sister Nancy and Father Jim encouraged me to become an adult friend! After completing a few hours training, I served as an adult friend throughout college. I was able to stay involved because we helpers had no prepping to do. We simply showed up! I'm also sharing this with the hope that someone reading today will feel drawn to SPRED just as I was...

If you're feeling a gentle nudge of encouragement to volunteer, consider this. When you become a part of SPRED, you gain as much from the sessions as the children do. During those opening minutes when your child-friend engages in that calming activity,

you are calmed as well. Anything gnawing at your psyche or your heart drifts off in the peace of those moments shared. When you gather to hear The Word, it is proclaimed just as Jesus shared it with the children in his company. I think Jesus



meant to keep his message simple for the rest of us as well. I assure you, like those children, and like me, you'll take those words to heart...


GOSPEL MEDITATION

Isn't it a bit weird that Catholics call the Pope "papa," father? This Sunday provides us with essential Scriptural background on the papacy, the petrine office. Jesus gives Peter the "keys to the kingdom of heaven," after witnessing to the special grace Peter has to know Jesus' true identity. Many have pointed out that the "keys"

refer back to the figure of Eliakim, King David's prime minister. True enough. But notice this is not mere authority or power. It's a family relationship. The Lord says to Eliakim, "He shall be a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem" (Isaiah 22:21). David's prime minister was a spiritual father to the family of Israel. Peter, and his successors, will be spiritual fathers in the family of the Church.

This means we have a serious obligation to not only recognize the Pope's authority, but also to love him with the affection of children for their papa. We should never speak about him with disrespect or rancor. We should listen to him with trusting hearts, and ignore the slander thrown at him in various media. When we show the world we are loving and obedient to our Holy Papa, perhaps they'll see more clearly that the Church is indeed God's beloved family.

CATHOLIC Q&A

Q: Why are Catholics required to give money to the Church?


A: Offering money and other goods to God and the Church is, before all else, a statement of gratitude. We see this when we look at how our spiritual ancestors showed their gratitude to God for the gifts they had received (e.g. Genesis 14:18-20 and Genesis 28:16-22). One of the ways they offered thanks to God was through a practice called "tithing," in which 10 percent of a person's goods (crops, livestock, money, etc.) were given back to God.

Today, the practice of tithing — giving 10 percent — is still common in many Protestant communities, but it is not required for Catholics. Instead, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that, "The faithful also have the duty of providing for the material needs of the Church, each according to [their] own abilities" (no. 2043). This means that, although we are not bound to practice "tithing" in the traditional sense, we do share a responsibility to share our money or other resources with our parish communities. Like our spiritual ancestors, we give as a sign of our gratitude for the many gifts that God has given to us. Beyond this, we also share our resources with other Catholic organizations to help them finance their ministries, to continue and grow their outreach to the poor and the needy, and to provide just wages for their employees.

How much we give depends on our individual circumstances, but since we share a responsibility for the programs, outreach, and health of our parish communities and Catholic organizations, this question gives us a wonderful opportunity to ask some important questions about the quality of our giving and what our priorities are. Remember, we are only stewards of our time, talents, and treasures and as the First Letter of Peter reminds us, "As each one of you has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied graces" (4:10).
