SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT - GOD IS WITH US!

While returning a favorite book to its shelf in my bookcase, I noticed an old catechism. That book is a relic from a childhood religion class. As though that book could hear me, I said aloud, "I thought I gave you away!" While taking it from the shelf, I spotted the edge of a bookmark. When I opened that book to see it, I found myself face-to-face with a very comforting picture of Jesus and a chapter titled GRACE.

Suddenly, I was whisked back in time, first, to a fourth-grade religion class, then to a college theology course and, finally, to my dying mom's bedside. Each of these stops contributed to my understanding of grace. My fourth-grade teacher, Sister Mary John Baptist, explained that grace is God's own life in us. Sister insisted that grace is one of the benefits of being a child of God. Years later, a theology professor insisted that, since God created every one of us, every one of us is God's child. If we are all God's children, we are all gifted with God's grace. At my mom's bedside, grace was undeniable. My mom assured me that she wasn't at all afraid to die because God would take care. She insisted, "Everyone is waiting for me!"

I vividly recall these lessons regarding grace because each one made perfect sense to me. They still do! You see, grace has touched my life since Day One. My childhood circumstances weren't always perfect. Still, grace was a part of every experience. Regardless of what took place, God was present amid the action. Throughout college, and despite my ongoing inclination to question everything back then, nothing changed my understanding of grace.

When I consider the family, friends and acquaintances who are so much a part of who I have become, I can't imagine this life without them. Though many now abide in the hereafter, I continue to rely on their influence. I look at our marriage (We're celebrating our 50th Wedding Anniversary!), and I wonder what would have become of Mike and me if grace had not intervened. Our sons and our daughters-in-law are constant sources of joy. They keep us focused on the

things that matter. Our grandchildren offer ongoing lessons regarding grace because they love us no matter what! Friends and family, both nearby and faraway, transform the unbearable into the doable. Our welcoming parish is our second home where grace abounds through your ongoing presence, friendship, and support! Yes, we have been graced!

Today's gospel reminds us that grace truly is God's own life in us. Matthew 14:22-33 begins this passage with, "After he had fed the people..." Now one would think that a well-fed crowd and a bountiful meal would remain a fresh memory for Jesus' friends. Yet. later that very evening, when their boat was engulfed by a storm, Jesus was the farthest thing from his disciples' minds. In the midst of that storm, when Jesus walked on raging water to be with them, Jesus' friends thought he was a ghost. That miraculous meal and Jesus' friendship were lost in the weather. Only Peter seemed to have held on to grace in that moment. Only Peter recognized that God really was always with them. So, despite the danger, Peter stepped out onto the water to meet his Lord. Only when Peter turned his attention away from Jesus and toward that storm did he get into trouble. Fortunately, Peter realized his mistake and he realigned his vision. In Jesus' hands, in God's presence, Peter was safe once again.

Fortunately for us, most of our troubles aren't as dramatic as Peter's walk through that storm. Fortunately for us, regardless of our troubles' intensity, grace remains to ease us on our way again and again. Still, like Peter, we worry. Still, when we look at the storms around us, we ask who will calm the crashing waves. We ask who will keep our boats afloat. We ask who will save us if those waves rush over our heads. Still, we ask. But, before those waves cover us, Jesus opens his arms to catch us one more time. Jesus reminds us that we are filled with grace after all. God's own life really is within us. It is when we realize this that we find the courage to get up and begin again, time after time after time...

GOSPEL MEDITATION



A man at my parish was struggling to overcome a habitual sin. He said to me, "Father, I know the chance that I will commit sin again is really high. Why should I keep confessing my sins? Isn't that dishonest?" Anyone who has felt the tyrannical power of sin — and who hasn't? — has pondered this kind of question.

I responded to him, "What was the probability Peter would walk on the stormy water?" After some silence, he said, "Zero. But when Jesus called, he did it." I could tell my penitent friend was re-framing the question from his own weakness to the greatness of the Lord's love for him. The question for us should not be one of human probabilities about our sin, but rather whether or not we will trust the Lord's grace in our lives.

This week the Lord is calling you and me to do the impossible: overcome sin with love. The only way to do that is to trust he is calling, and then to walk with the eyes of faith locked on

him. And if we sink, he will raise us up again and again. Of that, we can be 100% sure.





CATHOLIC Q&A

If we have a separation of church and state, how should faith influence the way we act in society, especially for those who have a role in the government?

A: No matter who we are, our inner lives affect the way we interact with the world. In the United States, we have freedom of religion. That means there is no official state-sanctioned religion. This does not mean that our faith is a private affair with no impact on public life! We have the ability to freely exercise our religious beliefs in accord with our conscience. Not only do we have the option to do so, but we also have the responsibility.

We're called to imitate Christ in every area of our life, not compartmentalize our faith. This means acting with respect and honoring the common humanity all we encounter. It means recognizing the person behind the politics. It also means standing up for the truth of human life and dignity, and advocating for just policies that serve the common good. The Vatican has produced a "Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church." It contains more detailed exposition of how our Catholic faith relates to various aspects of public life.


