

Dear SPA Family,

How often we ask for the sun, when it rains, or for rain, when the sun is shining - and the weather does not always change, as we would like... **We are asking for a raise,** for passing the exam, for a bus on time, for a smile from a girlfriend, for a job, for health for a child, for a longer life for a dying parent, for escape during a catastrophe... We ask... and yet our prayers often seem to be unanswered, as if Good was deaf or silent...

So sometimes we try to convince Him: If you listen to me, then... I'll pray, do pilgrimage or a pious act, make a donation to the poor, quit addiction! What can I do to make him listen to me?



Probably each of us has such an experience, a difficult, sometimes **dramatic experience of unanswered prayers.** We rebel in spirit, because it is written: *Ask, and it will be given you, seek and you will find...* (Mt 7: 7). And we ask, and we don't get, we don't find... How to reconcile it?!

Many times, in the Gospels we witness various miracles, sometimes very spectacular. But when we dwell on the texts of the Gospels, we are much more likely to witness prayers, whether whispered or shouted to heaven that remains unanswered. The despair and prayers of the mothers of Bethlehem children, the disappointed hopes of many blind people, the tragedies of the paralytics who remained on their beds ... Even the great and pious prophet John the Baptist did not experience a miracle, and only three of the thousands of dead were resurrected: Lazarus, the boy of Nain and Jair's daughter. And others?! Why not others? Why them and not me?!

For we need prayer more so that we may realize what is important to us. And above all, prayer is watching, it is hearing and listening, it is awakening! Perhaps **our prayers are OUR prayers too much**, perhaps they lack the original trust and inclination towards God: *After all, not as I want, but as you (Mt 26:39); However, not my will, but yours be done!* (Luke 22:42).

It's just that God works differently. He does not change everything according to our wishes, does not spread red carpets, and does not order obliging clappers. He just walks with us like the real Emmanuel - God with us.

He walks with us through the rocky paths of our life, like us in all but sin. **He knows our life.** He knows the salty taste of sweat when we work on a hot day. He knows the joy of wedding celebration. He knows the pain after the death of our friend. He knows hunger and fatigue. He knows the fear of running away from the more powerful. He knows the bitterness of betrayal by loved ones. He knows rejection by the majority. He knows the fear of dying. He knows the loneliness of death...

However, we can be sure of this: if we only want and invite Him to us, then no matter who we are, no matter where we are, **He - Emmanuel will always walk with us through life.** So, let's not keep asking: why not otherwise? Why them and not me?!

GOSPEL MEDITATION



Once I went to a hospice facility to celebrate Last Rites for an elderly dying man. His family had told me that he had been uncommunicative for days. At the conclusion of the ritual, we began to recite the Our Father prayer. To everyone's surprise, his lips moved, clearly mouthing the words to the Lord's prayer. Stripped of most of his faculties, the man could still pray those precious God-given petitions. A lifetime of prayer had planted the words even deeper than his failing consciousness.

Do we want the Lord's prayer to be as deeply embedded in us? If we want to be people of hope, we should. Recall that our Lord immediately follows the prayer by saying: "Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you" (Luke II:9). We only ask, search and knock because we hope that the request is not in vain. Everything we could possibly hope for is contained in the prayer. Praying the Our Father deepens our hope.

We should consciously pour all our hopes into the Lord's prayer; we should allow it to be an expression of hope, not simply rote words. Then, over time, it builds up our hope in God. It sinks deep into our souls and bodies. How blessed we are when these words of hope are on our lips, even when everything else seems to fail.

He replied, "I will forbear doing it for the sake of the forty.

Then Abraham said, "Let not my Lord grow impatient if I go on. What if only thirty are found there?"

He replied, "I will forbear doing it if I can find but thirty there." Still Abraham went on,

"Since I have thus dared to speak to my Lord, what if there are no more than twenty?"

The LORD answered, "I will not destroy it, for the sake of the twenty."

But he still persisted: "Please, let not my Lord grow angry if I speak up this last time. What if there are at least ten there?" He replied, "For the sake of those ten, I will not destroy it."

"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish?

Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children,

how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

CATHOLIC Q & A

This time of year, I attend a lot of weddings. Why do Catholic weddings need to take place in a church?

Technically, there is a clause in Church law that could allow for weddings to take place outside of a church, in a suitable space under special circumstances, but it requires the rare permission of the bishop. But the meaning of marriage goes very, very deep, and the Church has a vested interest in protecting that meaning. As Catholics, we don't see a wedding as an event that needs a pleasing backdrop.

Marriage is a sacrament, both an occasion of joyful promise and symbolic solemnity. It is a spiritual event. The loving bond of marriage symbolizes the mystical union between Christ and his Church. The man and woman profess lifelong vows of fidelity, and they receive supernatural grace from God to keep their promises. Receiving the sacrament of Marriage in a church has broader symbolic meaning for the couple as well. Marriage isn't simply two people in isolation from the world around them. Marriage is the joining of families and the beginning of a new, holy mission in the life of the couple. Weddings are sacred occasions, and it's fitting that they occur in sacred spaces.


