

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT - BLOOMING WITH JOY! BY MARY PENICH

When I turned my calendar to May a few days ago, I wondered where the past few months have gone. Our weather has included several spring-like

days, yet I felt wintery inside. The perennial greenery and blossoms which surround our home are beautiful. We've enjoyed more sunny than cloudy days, and birds have chirped happily from every direction. Even the persistent robin who insists upon building its nest over our patio light hasn't given up. Despite our best efforts to

discourage that bird, it continues its work in Spring's sunshine. So, why was I still in winter-mode?

The past few months have made the answer obvious. I learned of my sister's illness in early February. She spent that month in the hospital where tests determined just how sick she was. I visited often to offer a bit of company and encouragement. March brought more tests, more information, and a terminal diagnosis. My visits continued. Though her final outcome had changed, my sister's efforts remained the same –to get through each day as best she could. Some days were easier than others. Some days were too much for all concerned. Still, she persisted.

Looking back, I can't help smiling over my sister's efforts throughout this ordeal. Though it wasn't easy, she kept her wits about her. Her sense of humor and her sense of reality remained unscathed. Her ability to say precisely what she meant remained as well. After that terminal diagnosis was rendered, my sister looked upward often to say, "I want it to be today!" Though I'm certain God heard her every time, it took another four weeks for a response. In the meantime, visits with loved ones continued -precious moments which will remain with us all.

My sister enjoyed a special visitor just four days

before she passed. Her son was there when the music therapist arrived with her guitar. My sister perked up as she played. Though my sister's energy was depleted,



she sang. Though her volume was barely audible, she sang! My nephew was moved to tears as he hadn't seen his mom that happy in some time. What a gift that was! Just four days later, my sister breathed her last. Without fanfare or drama, she left this life and eased into the next. I was relieved that her suffering had ended. Though her illness hadn't caused terrible physical pain, she'd experienced the anguish of letting go of everything familiar to her within such a short time. That was pain enough. I had to let go as well...

As you can see, when I sat to write for you today, my sister was on my mind. I know that I'm repeating myself. I also know that those of you who've lost a loved one understand. It takes time to deal with loss. It takes time to adjust to our *new normal* without our loved ones. After stating the obvious, I'll share that the message of today's scriptures is also obvious. John's gospel (15:9-17) includes a portion of Jesus' parting words. The readings from Acts of the Apostles and I John illustrate how the disciples used those words to help them to carry on after Jesus' departure.

Though Jesus could have said much more to reassure his friends, John shares Jesus' simple advice: "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete: ...love one another as I have loved you." Considering what was coming, it might seem odd that Jesus spoke of joy. However, when we consider the rest of the story, Jesus' words make perfect sense. Fortunately, the disciples eventually took the joy in those words to heart.

In the reading from Acts of the Apostles (Acts 10:25-48), we hear Peter celebrating God's love with

humility. When a follower falls at his feet, Peter tells the man to stand, saying, "I myself am also a human being." Peter goes on to say that no distinctions are made among God's children. Every single one is loved dearly. The second reading, I John 4:7-IO, underscores Peter's assertion and leaves no doubt regarding



God's love for us. When I read these passages in the midst of my dark mood, that mood began to lighten.

Finally, I acknowledged that, like Peter, I'm a human being as imperfect as the rest of us. My wintry mood resembled the disciples' mood after Jesus died. It was only after mourning their loss and then acknowledging that Jesus' life continued after all that the disciples found peace. With that realization, I considered my sister's new life and her newfound peace. Suddenly and finally, my wintry mood blossomed into springtime!

GOSPEL MEDITATION



Once a man came to the Vatican and asked to see Pope John Paul II, claiming that they had been friends in Poland. When told of the man, the Pope said, "He is mistaken about our friendship. I don't recall ever having suffered with him." As it turned out, the man had never known the Pope. Now, I'm not sure if the story is totally factual. But doesn't the juxtaposition of *suffering* with *friendship* sound exactly like JPII? He understood that the deepest and most lasting friendships are forged in the fires of shared suffering. No suffering, no friendship. Amazing.

This week we hear Jesus say to the apostles and to us, **"You are my friends if you do what I command you"** (John 15:14). In Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, God entered the world of human suffering and transformed it into an avenue of friendship with Himself. Following His command — to love, to lay down our lives for others — will always entail suffering. But this suffering only deepens our friendship with Him. His suffering is ours; ours is His. We have become friends of God.

This week, how might you share your suffering with the Risen

Jesus? How might he be sharing his suffering with you, in the lives of those around you? Be attentive to that, and you'll find that you are indeed a friend of God, because you've suffered together a great deal. - Father John Muir ©LPi
