

Dear SPA Family,

Every day, we hear about various difficulties in which human suffering is especially dominant. Someone has lost their job unjustly, war breaks out elsewhere, and another shooting takes place in our country. Disease is also among these difficult and suffering matters. Long-lasting, painful, severe, incurable diseases. Various foundations and different people try to help a sick or needy person.

It was no different in Jesus' time. Leprosy was such a terrible disease for many reasons. First, because of great suffering. People suffering from leprosy lost feeling and experienced numerous



degenerations. Their body was devastated by the bacteria, and their appearance became repulsive. They were rejected by people due to the fear of contracting an infection and becoming unclean.

Jesus restored the health of ten lepers. He mainly restored their dignity, gave them a better tomorrow, and restored their lives. Jesus showed people His great mercy once again. And we've experienced this merciful love many times in our lives. Because we've also suffered from many diseases, both physical and spiritual. Every sin is our spiritual disease. We often experience healing from our sins, spiritual infirmities, and the things that distance us from God and others.

The Gospel of the ten lepers aims to teach us the importance of gratitude. Grateful for all that we've received in our lives from God. Because, unfortunately, we are often like those whom the Gospel has healed. We receive from God, we ask, and sometimes we forget to cultivate an attitude of gratitude. Only a grateful person can truly experience mercy.

Let us listen to the teachings of St. John Paul II, who often called us to an attitude of mercy. He said that it was mercy that should be the center of the Church's ministry, and therefore, each of us. The Pope called us to forgive, to reconcile with our neighbors, to help them rise from spiritual decline, and to take care of these ordinary human matters: to care for the poor and the poorest. He taught us:

The whole Church is directly called to render the service of love: "And as, at the dawn of her history, the Holy Church, when she joined the Eucharistic Supper with the Agape, showed herself to be completely united by the bond of love around Christ, so always she is recognizable by this sign of love as her duty and inalienable right. That is why the Church places special honor on mercy towards the poor and sick, and on the so-called works of mercy and mutual help, aimed at bringing help in various human needs."

Today, let us learn to be grateful to God for His mercy. But let us also learn to share this mercy with other people who often live close to us. And when participating in the Eucharist, let us ask that we know how to practice merciful love in our daily lives.

GOSPEL MEDITATION



Dorothy Day, the great Catholic activist, doubted God's existence. At least in her early adult years. But something changed when after giving birth to her daughter, she experienced an overwhelming gratitude. She later described how, as she held her daughter, the only appropriate response was a kind of unlimited gratitude. She had done nothing to deserve such a gift — this tiny, miraculous life — but there she was, flooded with gratitude, completely undone by the love of such a Giver.

Something similar occurs in Luke 17:19 when Jesus tells a healed leper, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." This man had already received physical healing through his faith. But the moment of an even deeper transformation came when he turned back, fell at Jesus' feet, and gave thanks. Like Dorothy, this man's gratitude led him to encounter the Giver.

Isn't that what we want, too? Gratitude to God has the power to break our chains of sadness, bitterness, and disenchantment. It empowers us to step out of the prison of self-pity and into the reality of God's abundant love. It shifts our focus from what we lack to what we have received, from what wounds us to what heals us.

Where do we learn this? The Mass. The priest prays: "It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks." Always. Everywhere. Not just when life is easy. Not just when prayers are answered as we expect. Gratitude is not a passive feeling; it is an act of faith. In the eucharist, we remember that Christ himself has given everything for us. And in this act of gratitude, we are healed.

He was a Samaritan.


Jesus said in reply,



THE ZEAL OF THE CONVERT

When you work in the Church, professionally or on a volunteer basis, you become familiar with the phenomenon known as "the zeal of the recent convert."

Sometimes, it really seems that the newly baptized are just stronger Catholics than the cradle Catholics. They smile more at Mass. They are awestruck by the Eucharist. They come out of the confessional beaming.

It's not that they are naive. It's not that they are in some honeymoon phase of religion, living outside of reality. It's simply that they remember. They remember what it felt like before the Eucharist or before Confession. They recall before the sacraments and the oil and the grace and the relief. It was more recent for them than for some of us older Catholics — especially those of us who were baptized as infants.

Let's ask ourselves: Have we become too comfortable? Do we receive God's grace with expectation instead of surprise? Have we ceased to marvel and wonder at the goodness of God? If the answer is a resounding yes, don't despair. Look at the Gospel—a literal nine times out of ten, God goes un-thanked and un-noticed.

So many of us have forgotten, or never understood, what it meant when the leprosy was washed from our souls. But when we remind ourselves, we become more keenly aware of the extraordinariness of the gift we have received.


