SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT - WHO'S COUNTING?

While searching my favorite bookstore for a new



release, I noticed shelves of children's books in the distance. I located the volume I intended to buy and then headed toward the children's offerings. I found several recent releases and many old favorites. I smiled as each one piqued my interest. After all, that's what a book is meant

to do! Years ago, I relied on similar books to urge my students to read. I made an art of enticing reluctant readers to read as many books as possible. After all, the best way to improve one's reading skills is to read!

I spent the bulk of my teaching career with children who were convinced that they were failures when it came to reading. For unknown reasons, they didn't naturally do what good readers do when they read. As a result, I made it my job to discover these students' strengths and to build upon them. I found books they'd enjoy, and I modeled good reading. I also praised their efforts. In the end, they became strategic readers who felt confident whenever they picked up a book.

My students' success was important to all their schoolwork. If you've spent time with children in any capacity, you know that they sort themselves out fairly quickly. In school, whether we call the best readers "Eagles" or "Bluebirds," everyone knows who they are. Whether we call the least capable readers "Buzzards" or "Cardinals," everyone knows who they are as well. The best math students gravitate toward one another. The best athletes reign on the playground. Most high schoolers know who will make varsity in every sport, who will run student council and who will be elected prom king and queen. We adults manage to sort and to rank ourselves as well. Though the categories may differ, the effects are perhaps more devastating. Some of us adults never discover our true value. Today's gospel (Matthew 20:1-16), encourages you and me to change that.

Matthew shares another of Jesus' parables about the kingdom of heaven. This time, Jesus likened the kingdom of heaven to a landowner's vineyard. That landowner went out one morning to find laborers. When he located a group, they agreed to the standard wage and went off to work. An hour later, the man hired another group whom he promised to pay as well. He hired even more workers at noon, at three o'clock,

and still more at five o'clock. When the workday ended at six o'clock, the landowner told his foreman to pay the laborers and to begin with those hired last. The foreman paid each one the standard day's wage. When those at the end of the line saw this, they assumed they'd receive a bonus for the ten hours they'd worked. However, much to their dismay, they received only the standard day's wage.

When those workers grumbled, the landowner spoke up. "I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and

go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?" The landowner scolded the laborers who resented his generosity because he knew that those who worked only six or three



or one hour also had families to feed and debts to pay. The landowner wasn't unjustly rewarding anyone. He simply gave each one what was needed to survive.

I admit to being relieved by that landowner's choice to ignore the numbers when it came to providing for his workers. I wonder if my students were relieved when I concentrated on the quality of their reading rather than the difficulty of the book they were reading. I'm even more relieved by Jesus' insistence that this is the way God provides for us. There are days when I feel that my mistakes far outweigh any good I may have accomplished. On those days, I don't want anything counted!

You know, when I worked with my reading students,



I kept a list of all the books each one read. At the end of their time with me, the children never failed to be amazed by how much their lists had grown. Today, Jesus' parable assures us that, as minimal as our good deeds may seem to us, God sees every one of them. In God's eyes, every act of

generosity and love adds goodness to the mix for each one of us, both here and in the hereafter. Now this is something we can all count on!



GOSPEL MEDITATION

Once I gave my three-year-old niece a certain toy for Christmas. When she opened it, she was happy. Shortly thereafter her five-year old sister opened another present from me: the same toy, along with some play jewelry. The three-year-old cried out: "That's not fair! Why'd she get the jewelry, too?!"

Let's face it: there's something about God's grace in our religion which bugs us. We love to look at others' blessings and cry out: "That's not fair!" Catholicism is not fair in the sense that it is a religion founded on God's grace which



is unmerited favor. God pours his mercy, love, and divine life upon us not because we're good but because He is infinitely good.

If you think the "not fair" quality of grace is easy to accept, consider how typically angry we get when we hear the parable of the workers who get paid way more than they deserve. The hyper-generous landowner says to the indignant hard workers, "Are you envious because I am generous?" Well, yes, they are, and so are we! Therefore, we have to reckon with this painful truth in order to move into the divine sphere of gifts, which is the world of Christ and his Church. Then we are able to move beyond a tit-for-tat world and into one where gifts are poured forth on those who don't deserve it — namely, upon us.
