One month ago, we celebrated our eldest grandchild's 18th birthday. A few weeks later, we celebrated our youngest grandchild's 7th birthday. These gatherings eased me into gratitude-mode. The other day, when stormy weather urged me indoors, I decided to relax by enjoying the things for which I'm most grateful. As you might suspect, my family tops that list. Since my dear husband was otherwise engaged (The poor guy was working out!), and our kids and grandkids were busy with their own schedules, I settled in with the next best thing: our family photo albums. Though I have hundreds of photos stored on my phone, they can't compete with the treasures that fill those albums.

I began my trek down Memory Lane with Mike's and my first album together. It features engagement and bridal shower photos. Our sons' baby albums caught my eye next. After moving on to their school

age photos, I turned to the newer albums that are filled with our grandchildren's photos. I admit that I shed tears off and on throughout the two hours I spent enjoying those photos. I was amazed at how often



I couldn't tell the difference between our sons' photos, while each of our grandchildren has a unique look. More amazing were my recollections of holding our sons and then each of their offspring as they slept.

For me, there is nothing more precious and peaceful than holding a sleeping baby. Every time I held my sons and each of my grandchildren, I instinctively swayed back and forth, back and forth as they breathed peacefully in my arms. My movement was in sync with their every exhalation. Even today, I absent-mindedly sway whenever I stand -a remnant from those loving encounters.

When I finally set those albums aside, it occurred to me that I'd found such joy in holding those little ones because it was then that my love for



them seemed most tangible. For the moments they rested in my arms, I could ensure that all was well in their little worlds. When I began preparing for this writing, I did so in gratitude-mode. You see, my reasons for giving thanks have grown exponentially. In the midst of that thought, another image of a babe in arms has caught my eye. It's a small paper sculpture displayed on my wall that I've had for

two decades. This image suggests our being held in God's hands. This artwork is as precious to me as those family albums because I consider each one of us to be that baby. I can't say or write this often enough!

God's loving hands embrace every one of us. Just as I couldn't help being absorbed by the rhythm of

my grandbabies' breathing, God's love draws us closer and closer. From that loving stant, God remains in sync with each one of us day after day. This is the reason Jesus persisted in revealing God's love for us in everything he said and did. Jesus knew and knows firsthand just how completely God loves each one



of us. Jesus simply had to spread the news!

In today's gospel (Luke 12:13-21), Luke shares another of Jesus' parables. This time, Jesus speaks in detail about the efforts of a wealthy farmer. While that farmer demonstrated his capacity to work very hard, he didn't seem to know very much about loving his fellow humans. Jesus told his friends, "There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?' And he said, 'This is what I shall do: I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones. There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, 'Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!' But God said to him, 'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

That poor rich man didn't understand that he was what mattered to God. Though he had likely worked very hard to accumulate his wealth, that farmer seems not to have attended to other, more important matters. Had he taken the time to care for those God had given him to love? Had he taken the time to talk to God? Though I don't believe God expects us to remain on bent knees twenty-four seven, I do think God enjoys being with us as we share our good news and our worries. Though we always rest in God's embrace, taking the time to be in sync with God makes the very best of those precious moments. Trust this grandma; I know!

It occurs to me that I'm not the only one who has albums full of photos of the people I love. Though God may not display hardcopies of you and me on a heavenly coffee table, rest assured that our images are always on God's mind and etched into God's heart. All God asks in return is that we tend to the things that matter most. We can begin by caring for one another. Why? Because we're happiest when we do this, and nothing is more pleasing to God than seeing us happy. As I wrote earlier, trust this grandma; I know!



GOSPEL MEDITATION



Recent studies suggest that millennials will be the first generation in America to be worse off than their parents in terms of financial earnings and job status. Many lament this. I propose that this week's Gospel provides a hopeful way to see the trend as good news.

The Lord Jesus says, "Take care to guard against greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist in possessions" (Luke 12:15). Greed damages us with the deception that we are what we possess. But to Jesus, this is simply not true. What makes us happy is who we are, who we become.

Does not the expectation that every generation should do better than their parents subtly mask the poison of greed? A similar attitude is mirrored in the man who demands that Jesus justly arrange his share of the family inheritance. Despite the injustice, Jesus will not play that game. In fact, he seems to prefer that the man have less than his parents. What good would

having more be to this man if he becomes enslaved and miserable by greed? What good would it be for us to have more if it means we become much less?

In allowing the man to have less, Jesus opens a space for him to become more: a man free to love. In that much more meaningful sense, perhaps he was better off than his parents. Maybe the millennials will be, too.




BAPTISM PREP CLASS



Among the many wonderful evangelization and catechetical ministries we have here at St. Paul the Apostle, our OCIA program is perhaps the one that most directly supports the great mission of the Church - the building of God's Kingdom on Earth. Christ instituted the Church and gave us the Sacraments to be the vehicles for our pilgrimage to his Kingdom in Heaven.

OCIA, or the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults, is a journey of faith formation that leads adult men and women into a deeper relationship with Christ, preparing them to come into full communion with His Church and receive the Sacraments of Initiation.

So, OCIA is for those adults who are seeking to be baptized... as well as those already baptized in another Christian tradition who seek to be Catholic. It is also for those baptized Catholic adults who have not yet received, and desire to receive, the other Sacraments of Initiation: Confirmation and Eucharist.

As baptized Christians, we all share in this mission: to build up God's Kingdom on Earth. So, even if you, yourself, don't fall into one of these categories of people seeking full initiation and communion with the Catholic Church, it's likely you know people who do - your spouse or fiancé, your adult son or daughter, a parent, a sibling, a friend or neighbor, a coworker or classmate. Most people who have gone through OCIA and are now active members of our faith community were led to OCIA by a trusted Catholic in their lives.

And, so, we appeal to you to boldly approach each and every person you know who might benefit from joining our OCIA program:

I once knew a godly woman who had truly tasted the bitterness of this earthly life. This woman knew pain. She knew sacrifice. She knew hard labor and loss, including the death of a cherished child. She worked each day at a low-paying job, waiting patiently for her 65th birthday, when she could retire and devote herself full-time to her grandchildren. She crossed off the dwindling days on her calendar like a first grader waiting for Christmas.

But I'll let you in on a secret: this isn't a sad story. I've only told you part of it.




