FURGIVE

MATTHEW 18:21-22

Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 CCD.

Dear SPA Family,

I've heard of someone who said he had no enemies and didn't know people who avoided him or didn't like him. I was impressed. What a wonderful thing to be able to say that about yourself! But that was only part of what he said, the other part was 'because I outlived everyone.'

It's hard not to have enemies; people who don't like us, who 'get under our skin,' and whom we don't like. It's also hard not to get hurt. Ridiculed at school, not invited to important parties, underappreciated at work, naively used, and so on...

We were told to 'forgive and forget.' If only we could forget, forgiveness would come easily to us. The scars of old wounds often refuse to heal. Past wrongs do not want to be past. The closer the friendships, the greater the disappointment, and the deeper the pain when the friendship is gone. Often the only forgiveness we can afford is reserved for strangers. It's easier to show forgiveness to strangers.

We were told to 'shake hands and makeup' when we were little boys and girls fighting in the schoolyard. That lesson seems to have vanished with the school's walls.



Sheila Cassidy, an English doctor and writer published her story as a

victim of torture, and she drew attention to human rights violations in Chile in the 1970s. She wrote: "I would never say 'you have to forgive' anyone. I dare not. Who am I to tell a woman whose father abused her or tell a mother whose daughter was raped that she must forgive? I can only say that no matter how much we have been hurt, however justified our hatred, if we develop it, and nurture it, it will poison us. We must pray for the power of forgiveness, because through forgiveness we are healed."

Nelson Mandela constantly reminded his fellow prisoners in South Africa that if they did not let go of their pains, they would remain in the grip of their captors.

By not forgiving, we hurt ourselves more than anyone else. Perhaps this is what Jesus means when he tells us in a parable how a ruthless servant was thrown into prison because he refused to forgive a fellow servant. I don't think Jesus was implying that God is withdrawing from His mercy. People's unforgiving attitude creates their own prison. They build walls of bitterness and perpetuate resentment, and there is no escape from it until they reach for forgiveness. Forgiveness is not easy, especially when the wound is very deep.

There is another person waiting for forgiveness. We must learn to forgive ourselves. How do you forgive yourself? Can you forgive yourself? If not everyone, many of us have something from the past, some event that hurts, some 'skeleton in the closet'. How much do we believe that there is at least one chance for forgiveness for us, if not necessarily 77 chances. The Psalmist reminds us today: the Lord is gracious and full of mercy (Psalm 103:8).

The Word of God, drawing before us ideals and challenges, reminds us that our mistakes are not eternal, they do not last a lifetime, that time and grace purify us, and that nothing or almost nothing is irrevocable.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

When I was in second grade, my prized possession was a metal Star Wars-themed lunch box. After school one day, another student ripped it from my hands. I helplessly watched in horror as my classmate threw it to the ground and violently stomped it into an unrecognizable heap of junk. I came home covered in tears of shame and rage. After a few months, I never thought about it again ... until I was almost thirty years old and on a retreat to prepare for ordination to the priesthood.

That childhood memory — and the attendant outrage — came back afresh. My spiritual director helped me in the process of acknowledging that I was angry because that kid owed me my lunch box. Then she helped me, through the grace of Jesus, to forgive the debt. Almost immediately I felt a new peace. I was amazed that I hadn't forgotten what I had lost, even from years before. Aren't we human beings simply amazing at remembering what people owe us?



We see this week in Jesus' parable a servant who is forgiven much but then commands another servant: "Pay back what you owe!" He can't forget or let go of how he was wronged. He remembers — and he becomes a monster because of it. If only he had remembered not only the debts owed to him, but also his greater debt owed to — and forgiven by — his master. It's natural for us to remember what others owe us. But when we contextualize those offenses in Jesus' mercy toward us and them, we're free to be merciful like the Master and less like a monster who never forgets.

At that, the servant fell down, did him homage, and said, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back in full.' Moved with compassion, the master of that servant let him go and forgave him the loan. When that servant had left, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a much smaller amount. He seized him and started to choke him, demanding, 'Pay back what you owe.' Falling to his knees, his fellow servant begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.' But he refused. Instead, he had the fellow servant put in prison until he paid back the debt. Now when his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were deeply disturbed, and went to their master and reported the whole affair. His master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to. Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?' Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt. So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart."


