SOMETHING TO THINK BOUT - THE SUN AND THE SON CHANGE EVERYTHING!

On the way to my office, I saw the grocery list I'd written the night before. Because we needed the few items on that list for dinner, I decided to head to the store. I admit that I wasn't excited about going out. Though I always enjoy fresh air, I was extremely tired of the gray sky that loomed overhead. It had been far too long since I'd seen the sun. As is my custom when life doesn't measure up to my expectations, I looked upward. "A little sun would be really nice," I prayed. With that, I begrudgingly grabbed my coat.

When I backed out of the garage, I couldn't believe what I saw! I looked at the clock on my dashboard. It was 10:37 A.M., January 29, 2024, and I was in the midst of the miraculous! The sun was shining brightly,



more brightly than ever! As I backed out of the driveway, the sun's rays flooded through my windshield. Though I could have lowered my visor, I didn't. I wanted every ray of that golden light to fill my car and me! As I drove, every house and car, lingering Christmas decorations and even the melting gray snow glowed in the sun's light. I smiled broadly as I prayed, "This is beautiful! Thank you, Dear God!"

As I drove on, I continued to smile. I added to my prayer. "Dear Patient God, I know the sun has certainly shone this brightly before, but, to me, it's as though I'm seeing it for the very first time. Thank you!!!" I arrived at the grocery store with my smile intact. A shopper who'd pulled in just after me walked toward the store with me. I couldn't help asking, "Isn't it wonderful to see the sun today?" She smiled as she responded. "Yes, indeed! This is great!" Though the sun's rays didn't follow me into the store, the joy they'd inspired remained.

A fellow shopper looking for the salmon I'd hoped to find asked the butcher where it might be. I laughed as I said, "I'll just follow you!" While selecting the perfect filets, I smiled and said, "This sale is almost as good as today's sunshine!" That shopper nodded, "You've got that right!" While I looked for my next item, an employee asked if he could help. When I turned to answer him, I spotted what I needed. "Thanks for asking. You helped me find this. "Now enjoy the sunshine!" He smiled and said, "Getting the carts in will be more fun today!"

At the checkout, I smiled as I placed my groceries onto the conveyor. "Can you believe how sunny it is?" I asked. The cashier's eyes lit up as she said, "I know! It's awesome!" Because her lane was near the window, she'd enjoy the sunshine all day. On the way home, I looked forward to getting to my office. I knew sunshine would pour through the windows as I wrote. I couldn't wait to share my smiling adventure with you. The sunbathed world around me and the warm rays that touched me filled me up with gratitude. That gratitude replaced the gloom which had overwhelmed me for days. That gratitude also inspired me with a far better understanding of the man with leprosy whom Jesus cured that day so long ago.

In his gospel (Mark 1:40-45), Mark wrote that a man stricken with leprosy approached Jesus to ask that he be cured. Jesus was filled with compassion. Without hesitation, Jesus touched the man, and he was healed. Jesus' only request was that the man tell no one.

As for me, I didn't have to read the rest of this gospel to know what happened next. That poor leper had suffered the ravages of his disease and the ravages of being separated from those he loved. Lepers were isolated, always keeping a safe distance from their healthy neighbors. When Jesus healed that man, he gave him both his health and his very life. How could he keep his good fortune to himself? He had to share his good news!



Today, I felt like that healed leper. When I dared to head out into the gloomy world, the sun surprised me by changing everything! Though I might have seemed a bit kookie to the people I greeted along the way, I couldn't help myself. Happily, they responded in kind. Mark's gospel tells us that the Son changed everything for our friend the leper. How could that grateful man not tell the world about his encounter with Jesus? Though everything isn't going perfectly



well for any of us, we all have much to be grateful for. Each one of us is loved and each one of us is cared for no matter what! Isn't this just the encouragement we need to share our gratitude as well? This crazy world of ours would certainly benefit from an onslaught of grateful smiles from every direction!

GOSPEL MEDITATION



Recently I had a skin rash, and it was awful. (Please don't tell anyone.) I am embarrassed to admit that I didn't handle it well. Complaining, whining, begging for sympathy, and crying were my responses to the merciless itching and burning. In the aftermath, a silver lining emerged. I feel a new heartfelt sympathy for all those vexed with chronic skin problems. If you've ever had a seemingly unending skin problem, you know how that sympathy flows up from deep inside.

This gut-level compassion is something like what the Gospel describes in Jesus when the sore-covered leper says, **"If you will it, you can make me clean."** At this, just before the healing, Jesus was **"moved with compassion."** The Greek word used here is strong and earthy, closer to "his bowels and guts trembled with the deepest emotions of sadness, pity, and love." In Jesus, God heals our infirmities not from a divine distance but by learning what it

feels like to be us. He acquires first-hand experience of what it costs us to be afflicted and still be faithful to God. He sympathizes with the burning, itching, and blistering of human existence in the deepest, first-hand way. To discover that is to touch Jesus' heart.

What in your life, right now, is breaking out like diseased skin? What is getting worse the more you try to soothe it? Perhaps only you feel it. Or maybe it's exposed to all. A bad habit, broken relationship, loneliness, fear of failure, self-hatred? Name it, and then find a way to bring it confidently to Jesus who will *feel what we are feeling*, and thereby heal us.

Saint Vs. Blessed

Question:

What is the difference between a “Saint” and a “Blessed”?

Answer:

The process of proclaiming someone as a saint in the Catholic Church has evolved over the course of many centuries. In the beginning, those honored as saints were almost exclusively biblical figures or martyrs. However, after the legalization of Christianity in the fourth century, new holy women and men came to be honored as saints, and this was often done by popular acclaim or by the local bishop or abbot.

It was Pope Gregory IX (who was pope from 1227 to 1241) who officially proclaimed that only the pope had the authority to add someone to the official list (the “canon”) of saints. This is the meaning of the word “canonization.”

Today, the saint-making process includes several steps, including detailed studies of the person’s life and a recognition that they died as a martyr or lived a life of “heroic virtue.” Once someone is recognized as a martyr or if a miracle is attributed to their intercession, they will be beatified and honored as “Blessed.” This means that they can be celebrated by Catholics in a particular country or region or by the members of certain religious community. If another miracle occurs and is approved, then the “Blessed” is canonized and honored with the title “Saint,” meaning that they are now officially recognized as a universal model of holiness and an intercessor.

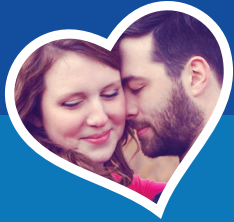
