

# **SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT - IT'S NEVER EVER TOO LATE!**BY MARY PENICH

Every week, I prepare to fill this space by reading the scriptures for the coming Sunday. Sometimes, as is the case today, I read them several times until the message sinks in. Usually, a recent event that relates to the theme comes to mind and I have my story. Today, I find myself struggling with the gospel, and I'm not quite sure where to go from here...

Though it's been 24 years since the attack and 10 days since we observed its anniversary, whenever I acknowledge the events of September 11, 2001, a chill runs down my spine. This date

runs down my spine. This date marks an extremely painful time for us all. Much to my dismay, similar suffering continues in our world. This past September II, another horrible shooting occurred. When will we ever learn? Perhaps this is the reason I'm troubled by Jesus' words in today's gospel (Luke 16:1-13). Jesus references a man who was a petty

thief and then highlights this guy's crafty evildoing. Why?

That day, when the crowd gathered to listen, Jesus offered his parable about a steward who cheated his master. When the master discovered this, he called the man in. After hearing what that steward had to say, the master planned to fire him. Now the dishonest steward realized the gravity of his situation, and he took action. The steward's goal was to save himself from a life of manual labor and to ensure his future. So, he went to his master's debtors. The steward told each one to cut his debt by the percentage that would have

been his commission. That way, those debtors would be grateful to him, and he would have stolen no more from his master. The steward's newfound allies would certainly help him when his master eventually fired him. During that final accounting, the master acknowledged the steward's efforts.



He wasn't surprised that his steward found a way to save himself. In this parable, Jesus focused on the creativity of the dishonest steward. I wondered what lesson could be found here. Then, I wondered again. Was Jesus suggesting that we should be equally creative when it comes to doing good?

Though we observed the anniversary of 9-II ten days ago, I think we still have reason to remember. Most of us recall our whereabouts when we heard the news that a plane had hit the World Trade Center. My memories include the school half-full of military children where I taught. I'll never forget my fear as I worried that the Great Lakes Navy Base might be a subsequent target. How would we tell our students if their parents had been hurt? How would we help them

all? In the midst of these memories, I also recall what happened here at Saint Paul's the following weekend. As we gathered, our interactions with one another were somehow different. Was it my imagination or were young parents holding their babies a bit closer? Was it my imagination or were more children perched on a parent's knee than sat fidgeting at their sides? Was it my imagination or did couples hold hands long before and long after we recited the Lord's Prayer? Was it my imagination or did those to whom I offered communion have an intense longing in their eyes- a longing I felt with them?

In my most creative moments, my imagination is incapable of conjuring images as wholesome and Godlike as those that unfolded around me in this church that weekend and for many weeks afterward. Our entire country responded

as one people united to love our wounds away. It occurs to me that nothing nourishes the human spirit more than love graciously given and love graciously received. The only antidote for evil at its worst is love. If we hope to conquer the horror that unfolded twenty-four years ago and the horror that threatens today, we must



that threatens today, we must mobilize without delay! I've often heard, "Pray as though everything depends on God and work as though everything depends on you." Today, an alternative seems appropriate: Pray as though everything depends on God, and love as though everything depends on you, because, indeed, it does!

Those who plotted the 9/II attacks and the many who have followed in their footsteps acted with unwavering conviction. Their commitment, though twisted and perverted, was unquestionable. Like the devious steward in today's gospel, they did precisely what was necessary to achieve their goals. Our challenge is to counter the hatred in this world with equally passionate resolve. We must become determined forces who extend God's love to all people every step of the way. We must mobilize as individuals, families, neighborhoods, parishes, towns, a country and a world to teach our children and to reteach ourselves to love as completely as evildoers hate.

Like that steward's master, Jesus challenges us all to take an accounting. Jesus asks us all to be passionate and creative –like that steward– not in the ways of evil, but in the ways we find to love one another. Though this 9/11 reflection may be 10 days late, it's NEVER too late to commit ourselves to love.



#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**



Before I was a priest, I was a lazy worker for a retail Apple store. Hearing a rumor that my boss was going to fire me, I secretly sold iPhones for half-price, gave away dozens of free iPads, and donated several brand-new laptops to managers in other stores in the mall. After a week, my boss called me into his office. He knew what I was up to. He said I had cost the store thousands of dollars. "Really great work, John," he said. "I am going to recommend you to be my assistant manager and double your pay." I was amazed.

And so are you. Which is understandable because it never happened. How could it? My tall tale is a retelling of Jesus' brow-furrowing parable we hear this week. A lazy, dishonest steward defrauds his boss and then the "master commended the dishonest servant for acting prudently" (Luke 16:8). What is the Lord saying to us?

Most of us treat our spiritual lives like a lazy teenager at an Apple store. We really don't care. We go through the motions. Then, if we are lucky, something happens that shakes us to spiritual action; to employ whatever time, money, and resources we have to build around us a strong network of love. Every saint did that. Our Lord is so good he wants us to use his stuff to forgive debts and to bless others. He wants us to ensure our future. So do it!

and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones.


If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth,



#### SAINT BIO

#### St. Pius of Pietrelcina | September 23

Best known as Padre Pio, St. Pius was born Francesco Forgione in 1887 in Pietrelcina, Italy. As a young boy he suffered many illnesses including typhoid. He joined Capuchin Franciscans at 15 and took the name of Pius or "Pio" in honor of Pope Pius I. He was ordained in 1910, and at this time he received the marks of stigmata, the wounds of Christ, but they eventually healed. Frequent illnesses continued to plague him as a young man.


Padre Pio served in the Italian Medical Corps during World War I, but he was discharged early because of illness, which was likely tuberculosis. He was assigned to the friary in San Giovanni Rotondo. In 1918, while continuing to serve at the friary, the stigmata appeared again, and this time remained until his death.


Many faithful came to see him at the friary, his days were long, beginning with Mass at 5 a.m. then hearing confessions all day with breaks to bless the sick. A simple man, content to do God's will on earth and with the ardent desire to serve the sick and poor in whom he saw Christ, he urged a hospital, Casa Sollievo della Sofferenza (House for the Relief of Suffering), to be built in San Giovanni Rotondo. It opened in 1956.

Padre Pio died at the age of eighty-one in 1968 and in 2002 Pope John Paul II proclaimed him "St. Pio of Pietrelcina."
