MATTHEW 11:28



Dear Spa Family,



In his teaching, Jesus often used images taken from everyday life; like in the parable of the sower. The sower is an image of God who is generous in his love and mercy. One might even say that He is like a prodigal farmer because He throws his seed on the road, on rocky ground, and among thorns. God is lavish in his love. He generously shares mercy because he wants every person to have a life. The greatest sign of God's generosity is that he sent his Son into the world. Jesus - the Incarnate Word is God's seed that is sown on every ground, that is, in the heart of every human being.

The road is an image of a person who listens to the word but does not understand it. Most of the world's humanity has heard of the existence of Jesus. However, just hearing that someone like Jesus existed is not enough to believe. Without personally accepting Jesus as Savior and understanding His message, he remains indifferent to His message. He needs to consciously accept and understand it.

The rocky ground is an image of a person who welcomes Jesus with delight and enthusiasm. He begins to live by faith, but there is no constancy. He suddenly converts and begins to live by faith, but only for a moment. When the emotions of the first admiration for God subside, he returns to his old lifestyle. He makes a resolution, a commitment, but is unable to keep it, he becomes discouraged and gives up. Faith, like anything we want to bring value to our lives, requires consistency and perseverance.

The ground of thorns is an image of a believer, even sincerely involved in a relationship with God. This person wants to grow in faith, tries hard, and doesn't consider himself just an occasional believer. However, he is unable to defend his faith among friends, maybe even family. It may also happen that the commitment to work means that there is no time to take care of his faith. It can also be the environment in which he lives, which distances him from God. He has less and less time for prayer, coming to Mass, and meetings with the group of believers he used to attend. He grows lukewarm until he realizes he doesn't believe.

The fertile ground is an image of a person who tries to understand and knows who Jesus is. It is someone who finds time for personal prayer and is faithful to the values of the Gospel in everyday life. This is someone who tries to persevere on the path of faith, even in the face of adversity and difficulties. He is aware and convinced that it is worth being a believer. Such a person is able to bear abundant fruits of faith. Such fruits are joy, peace, love, forgiveness, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Gal. 5:22).

Faith comes from hearing and accepting the word of God. For faith to grow, the word of God needs the right soil to grow. To keep faith alive, it needs our daily choices. We can't have everything at once. It is a choice between evangelical values and the spirit of this world.

What kind of soil am I? How abundant harvest of life by faith do I bring?

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Do you ever feel restless? I certainly do. Daily tasks and challenges, but also the more basic demand of simply existing — sooner or later, this can all feel crushing and tire us out.

Which is why Jesus' words are such stunningly good news: "Come to me all you who labor and are burdened and I will give you rest" (Matthew II:28). How vastly weird that this man speaks as though he is capable of giving us the deep repose we desire. Is his claim the height of absurd grandiosity? No, because next he immediately proclaims that he is "meek and humble of heart." We here touch a mystery: Jesus is capable of giving us rest because he is the one who forever reposes in the heart of God the Father. He is "yoked" to the Father in his divinity. But he is humbly "yoked" to us, sharing in our humanity.

The good news, my fellow tired-out friends: we don't have to despair in our burdens and exhaustion, no matter how heavy they feel. This week, join me in opening our hearts to hear him say to us, "Come! I will give you rest." We come to him in the Church, Eucharist, the Scriptures, prayer, in the poor. There he will give us rest.





Be more than a lukewarm parishioner. Be the kind of Catholic you want your children to be.
