Though he wounded his father deeply, he was forgiven! The welcome offered by that dad promises far more than I once might have hoped for upon my own passing into eternity. I can't help asking, "Is it true, Dear of the Prodigal Son since childhood, I didn't God, that you'll be as happy to see each one of us?" The **First Saturday Prayer Group** has been meeting since April 2, 2005, which just also happens to be the death anniversary of Saint Pope John Paul II. The devotion which is also called the Act of Reparation to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary was requested by the Virgin Mary according to Sister Lucia of Fatima in an apparition at Pontevedra Spain in December 10, 1925.

According to Servant of God Sister Lucia, the First Saturdays of reparation is for the atonement for the ways in which people offend the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

1.) attacks upon the Immaculate Heart of Mary

2.) attacks against her Perpetual Virginity

3.) attacks upon her Divine Maternity and the refusal to accept her as the Mother of all mankind

4.) for those who try to publicly implant in children's hearts indifference, contempt, and even hatred of the Immaculate Mother

5.) for those who insult her directly in her sacred images.

The group also offered their prayers for the forgiveness of the blasphemies against the Immaculate Heart of Mary and the Blessed Trinity, and for the consecration of Russia. Christians have always honored the Blessed Virgin on Saturday because of her constant faith in Jesus on that first Holy Saturday before the Resurrection.
