SOMETHING TO THINK BOUT - WRAPPED IN GOD'S PRESENCE BY MARY PENICH

Beside Advent, December brought several early submission deadlines for our parish bulletin. When I began thinking about this reflection, my

dear husband was running Christmas errands. At the same time, I fretted over some still unacquired gifts and the cookies I hoped to bake before Christmas Eve. I found no consolation in acknowledging that, by the time this reflection

is published, Mike's errands and my worries will have faded into our memories of Christmas 2023. By the time I put my thoughts into words, welcoming New Year 2024 demanded my attention.

The best and worst of 2023 added much to our collective history. As I turn my attention to the last days of the year, I hope that we'll embrace what lies ahead with a measure of the peace we celebrated on Christmas Day. Though I'd like to think that we all found joy, hope, and love amidst our Christmas festivities, it is the peace found in God's company which sustains me.

I think inner peace is key to embracing all that this life holds for us. Be it next year, next month,



tomorrow or the moment at hand, it's far easier to face what lies ahead when we enjoy the peace we find in good company. As I consider the plight of the Holy Family whom we celebrate today, I think it was their sense of God's presence which empowered them to carry on. Dealing with Mary's unexpected pregnancy was challenging enough. Managing Jesus' birth far from

home added to Mary's and Joseph's already complicated lives. Not long afterward, they were required to fulfill Jewish Law by traveling to the temple in Jerusalem to consecrate their baby son to God.

In today's gospel (Luke 2:22-40), Luke tells us that Simeon was in the temple when Joseph and Mary arrived with Jesus. Simeon had spent his life waiting for the Messiah. He begged God not to take him until he'd seen the promised one. When Jesus' parents carried him in, Simeon knew immediately that he was in the company of the one for whom he waited. Simeon embraced Jesus with uncontainable gratitude and exclaimed, "Now, Master, you may let your servant go... for my eyes have seen your salvation." Simeon told Mary that Jesus would bring both wonder and sorrow into her life and that he would bring salvation to all of Israel.

Simeon's welcome evidenced the peace God's presence had brought into his life. Trustful as they were in God's plans for them, poor Mary and poor Joseph didn't expect the reception Simeon offered them. What a frightening sense of responsibility they must have felt! How would they raise a child destined to change the world? Without revealing Mary's and Joseph's intentions, Luke closes this passage by sharing that "...they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him."

It occurs to me that Luke's observations fail to acknowledge the difficulties Mary and Joseph

faced when they left the temple that day. Were there whispers regarding the timing of Jesus' birth? Did Mary question her response to the angel, "May it be done to me according to your word"? Did fear tug at Joseph's heart? Of all that mattered to them, nothing mattered more than caring for Jesus. Despite



their fear, Mary and Joseph knew God was with them and they stayed the course.

If you love someone, you understand how Mary and Joseph were able to allow Jesus to turn their lives upside-down. Parents work long hours to provide for their children. Caregivers smile as they bathe their elderly loved ones. Grandparents rock their new grandchild and stack blocks with a toddler despite their aching backs. We dig into our pockets for our last bit of cash and drop it into a bell-ringer's bucket. We work at caring for those we've been given to love because God has worked at caring for us. On this Holy Family Feast, we celebrate the persistence of Mary and Joseph in raising Jesus and Jesus' eventual persistence in loving us.

This week, when you begin to use your 2024 Calendar, remember that the three hundred sixty-five days ahead promise possibilities and challenges which we'll never face alone. The peace we find in God's company will sustain us just as it sustained Mary and Joseph and their amazing son.

GOSPEL MEDITATION



I remember the first time my older sister asked me if I wanted to hold her newborn son. Terrified, I told her I didn't think it was a good idea. My résumé had nothing to suggest I would be a qualified baby holder. But she warmly told me, "I'll help you hold him." It struck me that she is baby's mother. She is the one who decides who is qualified to hold him. I took him in my arms and soon I began to feel comfortable with that tiny little warm cooing creature in my arms, and soon I no longer feared holding him. Now, twenty-seven nieces and nephews later, holding a newborn child is one of the great joys of my life.

Do we sometimes think that Jesus is given only to the highly qualified, special religious people? In the Gospel of Luke today we hear about the presentation of the Lord in the temple. The newborn son of God is passed around like a baton in a relay race, not guarded like a precious jewel or a breakable china dish. We can see him going from the arms of Mary to Joseph, then to the priest performing the ceremony, then to Simeon the old man, then to Anna the old widow. Each one receiving him and then handing him to the next. A tidal wave of joy and thanksgiving follows wherever he is placed.

Believe me, you are qualified to hold Jesus in your arms. How can I say that with such confidence? Because the mother decides who is qualified. The Blessed Virgin, embodied in the Church, holds him out to you and me. She rejoices to place him in our arms to hold, and to hand him on, too.

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, They took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord.

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit

that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, He took him into his arms and blessed God, saying:

"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples,

a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted —and you yourself a sword will pierce— so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer.

And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.


