SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT- WHAT ARE YOU THINKING?

I've spent much of Lent 2022 considering years earlier as the child of all that Jesus said and did when he walked among a tradesman and his wife. us. Images from past visits to the Holy Land make This one who agitated the these reflections quite vivid. Only remnants of the scribes and Pharisees and structures and streets of Nazareth remain. Still, those relics brought Jesus' childhood and early adulthood to life for me. Jerusalem teems with modern-day locals, businesses, and tourists. At the same time, ancient ruins and growth in the Garden of Gethsemane elicited visions of Jesus at work. Jesus' teaching, his kindness toward outcasts and his suffering and death overwhelmed me then, just as they do today. I find myself grateful, but also distraught in the face of how little we humans have changed since then...

I've also spent much of Lent praying for the people of Ukraine and for an end to the war on their country. My visits to Israel revealed unsettling aspects of life in a country whose enemies are only a border away. I shivered as our bus drove past barbed wire fences and minefields intended to keep Israel's Jesus' contemporaries suffered enemies at bay. under oppressive Roman rule. Our Israeli guide remarked that things haven't changed much for their descendants. As I turn my thoughts and prayers to Ukraine, I fully agree.

Every thought regarding the things Jesus said and did on our behalf is accompanied by a prayer for the survival of Ukraine and its people. More prayers have followed for those closer to home who also suffer. I've looked upward often to ask, "Jesus, what were you thinking back then? What are you thinking today?" Before he can answer, I remind myself that Jesus abandoned the God of vindication and punishment whom the Pharisees held up to the people, and I find myself with a glimmer of hope. Jesus revealed the God of mercy and forgiveness, acceptance and love to all who would listen. Jesus reveals the same to you and to me, to the people of Ukraine and to the suffering everywhere in this world of ours -even to Russian soldiers who may be serving more out of fear than resolve...

That first Palm Sunday, the people of Jerusalem waved palm branches and shouted hosannas to welcome Jesus into the city. I can't pretend to know Jesus' thoughts as the crowd cheered him on. I can only turn to the words and deeds that brought Jesus to that moment in time to gain some perspective. This one who rode into Jerusalem had arrived not many ahead?

who drew the Romans' scorn, grew into manhood among Nazareth's laboring citizens. Somehow, Jesus emerged to become teacher and brother to us all.



I also cannot pretend to know God's thinking through any of this. Jesus' life tells me that God remains ever steadfast in God's choice to love us. God sent Jesus to make that love known. Jesus began that work at a local wedding when he assisted friends who had run out of wine. Jesus sealed his commitment by seeking baptism from his cousin John. Jesus gathered a motley crew of followers who resemble you and me at our very best and our very worst. Then, Jesus taught those disciples how deeply God loved them and how important it was that they pay that blessing forward by loving one another.

Suddenly, I find myself with another question: What am I thinking in the midst of this world's troubles? When I read Luke's account of Jesus' passion, I must acknowledge that God didn't step in to change anything that transpired. We humans have been created with free will and, when Jesus was born as one of us, he was born with the same. Jesus' life ended as it did because nothing ever kept him from responding to those he met along the way. When some did their best to derail Jesus' work, Jesus responded with amazing wisdom which they couldn't refute. When some had no one else to whom to turn, Jesus responded with absolute love. When some who'd lost their way stumbled onto Jesus' path, he gave them direction with clarity and without judgment. When some pierced his wrists and feet with nails, Jesus forgave them with some of his last words.

What am I thinking in the midst of this world's troubles? I'm thinking that you and I are in unique positions to respond as Jesus did in ways only we can. You and I are invited to bask in hosannas, to embrace our lives' work and to hand ourselves over to whatever lies ahead. You and I are invited to change things for the better wherever we find ourselves, just as Jesus did. This week, you and I are also invited to experience the depth of God's love by walking with Jesus through his passion and death. Is there a better way to prepare for the work
